



ENERGY HORIZONS, our 6-part look at understanding the importance of energy, climate change and resource depletion, concludes the week before Thanksgiving.




The film tells the little-known story of a deadly race massacre and carefully orchestrated insurrection in North Carolina's largest city in 1898 — the only coup d'état in the history of the US. Stoking fears of "Negro Rule," self-described white supremacists used intimidation and violence to destroy Black political and economic power and overthrow Wilmington's democratically-elected, multi-racial government. Dozens of Black residents were murdered, and thousands were banished. The story of what happened in Wilmington was suppressed for decades until descendants and scholars began to investigate.

In the 1890s, Wilmington, North Carolina, was a thriving multi-racial community with a majority Black population. A prosperous port city, it offered plenty of opportunity for newly freed Black citizens, who competed with whites for skilled labor jobs as brick masons, blacksmiths and carpenters. There was a flourishing Black professional class of doctors, teachers and lawyers. Blacks owned property and businesses, invested in banks, served as police officers, and held public office in multiple levels of government, including the US House of Representatives.

But as the multi-racial government expanded and the social and economic status of Black citizens increased, so did the resentment of a group of white elites, who were losing power. Their leaders promoted the myth that African Americans were arming themselves when, in fact, it was the white community that was preparing for war.

On November 8, 1898, Election Day, the white supremacists took control of the state legislature. The coup issued what came to be known as the "White Declaration of Independence," declaring that they would never again "be ruled by men of African origin."

Following the coup, many white newspapers throughout the country reported the incident as a "race riot" and suggested that Black citizens were the aggressors. At least 60 Black men were shot and killed (an accurate number will never be known) and Black women and children were terrorized, running into nearby swamps and cemeteries for refuge.

"What happened in Wilmington had the effect of putting the final nail in the coffin of democracy in North Carolina," said Robin D.G. Kelly, Department of History, UCLA. "1898 was the culmination of a process that had begun in many states throughout the South. That is the end of Black voting rights, Black civil rights until the 1960s."



BRENDA LEE: ROCKIN' AROUND

Discover the story behind singer Brenda Lee's iconic songs and explore how her early fame and life of poverty shaped her artistry across pop, rock'n'roll and country. Known for her Christmas classic and Billboard hit "Rockin' Around The Christmas Tree," she is still a force in music today. The film features interviews with Keith Urban, Pat Benatar, Neil Giraldo and many others.

Brenda Lee was born Brenda Mae Tarpley in the charity ward of Grady Hospital in Atlanta, Georgia. Her family was poor. As a child, she shared a bed with her brother and sister in a series of three-room houses without running water. Life centered on her parents finding work, their family, and the Baptist church. She grew up loving to sing and often sang solos in church.

Lee achieved her biggest success on the pop charts in the late 1950s through the mid-1960s with rockabilly and rock and roll-styled songs. The biggest-selling track of Lee's career was a Christmas song, "Rockin' Around The Christmas Tree." Her signature song, "I'm Sorry," became one of the biggest hits of the 1960s. And this was all before she reached the ripe old age of 20.

On the Billboard Hot 100 chart dated December 9, 2023, "Rockin' Around the Christmas Tree" topped the Hot 100 for the first time in the United States becoming Lee's third #1 hit and first since her 1960 single, "I Want to Be Wanted." At 78, Lee became the oldest female artist and oldest artist overall to top the Hot 100.

LEONARDO DA VINCI

A FILM BY KEN BURNS,
SARAH BURNS AND DAVID McMAHON

LEONARDO DA VINCI looks at how the artist influenced and inspired future generations, and it finds in his soaring imagination and profound intellect the foundation for a conversation we are still having today: what is our relationship with nature and what does it mean to be human.

Set against the rich and dynamic backdrop of Renaissance Italy, at a time of skepticism and freethinking, regional war and religious upheaval, the two-part film brings the artist's towering achievements to life through his prolific personal notebooks, primary and secondary accounts of his life, and on-camera interviews with modern scholars, artists, engineers, inventors, and admirers.

"No single person can speak to our collective effort to understand the world and ourselves," said Ken Burns. "But Leonardo had a unique genius for inquiry, aided by his extraordinary skills as an artist and scientist, that helps us better understand the natural world that we are part of and to appreciate more fully what it means to be alive and human."

The film weaves together an international group of experts, as well as others influenced by Leonardo who continue to find a connection between his artistic and scientific explorations and life today. As the filmmaker and Leonardo admirer Guillermo del Toro says at the beginning of the film, "the modernity of Leonardo is that he understands that knowledge and imagination are intimately related."

"As we set out to explore Leonardo's life, we realized that while he was very much a man of his time, he was also interested in something more universal," said Sarah Burns. "Leonardo was uniquely focused on finding connections throughout nature, something that strikes us as very modern today, but which of course has a long history."

Born out of wedlock to a notary and a peasant woman, Leonardo distinguished himself as an apprentice to a leading Florentine painter and later served as a military architect, cartographer, sculptor, and muralist for hire. His paintings and drawings, such as the Mona Lisa, The Last Supper, and the Vitruvian Man, are among the most celebrated works of all time and his art was often equaled by his pursuits in science and engineering.

Leonardo's personal story is told within the larger context of the Italian Renaissance, a blossoming of art and architecture informed by mathematics and science, and an awareness of the natural world, but also steeped in a renewed interest in classical ideals.

In Part One, "The Disciple of Experience," the film takes us into the world of the bottega, the studio or workshop where Leonardo apprenticed and learned how to prepare paints but would also have discussed math and poetry with his master – the artist Verrocchio – and fellow apprentices. By the age of 20 – in 1472 – he had joined a painter's guild, whose members were among the most talented artists in Florence, including Filippino Lippi, Domenico Ghirlandaio, Pietro Perugino, and Sandro Botticelli.

In Part Two, "Painter-God," we see that Leonardo has left Milan and to travel to Venice and then back to Florence, the city where he had developed his artistic skills. It was there that Leonardo reached out to Cesare Borgia, the military strongman who led the Papal troops and was in search of an engineer and cartographer. He developed new ways to map cities and designed new technologies for invading and defending them. Always fascinated with the movement of water, he also devised a way to divert the Arno, the river that flows west from Florence to Pisa and the sea beyond. The plan, which never came to fruition, would have denied Pisa, Florence's long-time adversary, access to the river.

In 1516, Leonardo received an invitation from the young King of France to move to Amboise, France, with the title Premier Painter and Engineer and Architect to the King. He relocated there with three of his unfinished paintings, The Virgin and Child with Saint Anne, Saint John the Baptist and the Mona Lisa. He would die there three years later at age 67, in 1519.

As the biographer Serge Bramly explains, at the end of his life "there's a sense of disillusionment, he realizes that he won't be able to see all of his projects through to the end... But just because a project is impossible to complete does not mean that it must be abandoned. On the contrary, that's perhaps what gives it its greatness, its nobility."

The broadcast of LEONARDO da VINCI will be accompanied by educational materials for middle and high school classrooms, highlighting recent research and perspectives. The materials will be available at the Ken Burns in the Classroom hub on PBS LearningMedia.



SISTERS RISING features six Native American women reclaiming personal & tribal sovereignty in the face of violence. Native American women are 2.5 times more likely to experience sexual assault than all other American women. One in three Native women report having been raped during her lifetime and 86% of the offenses are committed by non-Native men. These perpetrators exploit gaps in tribal jurisdictional authority and target Native women as "safe victims."

The film follows women who refuse to let this pattern of violence continue in the shadows: a tribal cop in the midst of the North Dakota oil boom, an attorney fighting to overturn restrictions on tribal sovereignty, an Indigenous women's self-defense instructor, grassroots advocates working to influence legislative change, and the author of the first anti-sex trafficking code to be introduced to a reservation's tribal court. Their stories shine an unflinching light on righting injustice on both an individual and systemic level.
