# MAKING BLACK AMERICA

THROUGH THE GRAPEVINE

hosted by  
HENRY LOUIS GATES, JR.

**Tuesdays October 4, 11, 18 & 25 – 9pm**

For centuries, 'The Grapevine' has connected Black Americans in formal and informal networks, not just as a way of communicating, but of building and sustaining communities large and small," said Henry Louis Gates, Jr., the program's host, writer, and executive producer. "From churches to fraternal and sororal organizations to Black Twitter, this is the story of the making of Black America and how, in the making, a people did more than survive the onslaught of enslavement and segregation. They redefined America and its cultural gifts to the world.

The film chronicles the vast social networks and organizations created by and for Black people beyond the reach of the "White gaze." The series recounts the establishment of the Prince Hall Masons in 1775 through the formation of all-Black towns and business districts, Historically Black Colleges and Universities, destinations for leisure and the social media phenomenon of Black Twitter. Gates talks with with noted scholars, politicians, cultural leaders and old friends to discuss this world behind the color line and what it looks like today.

**Episode One** – As early as 1775, free Black people in the North and South built towns, established schools, and held conventions creating robust networks to address the political, economic, and social needs of the entire Black community.

**Episode Two** – With the hopes of a multi-racial community dashed, African Americans turn within, creating a community that not only sustains but empowers. From HBCUs to Black businesses to the Harlem Renaissance to political organizations, Black life flourished.

**Episode Three** – To survive a period of economic cataclysm and global war, African Americans relied on informal economies, grassroots organizations and cultural innovations behind the color line to sustain themselves and dismantle the oppressive realities of Jim Crow.

**Episode Four** – Despite the gains of legal desegregation, all Black political and cultural movements - from Black Power to Black Twitter - continued to provide a safe space or a community riven by class, sexuality and generational divisions to debate, organize and celebrate.

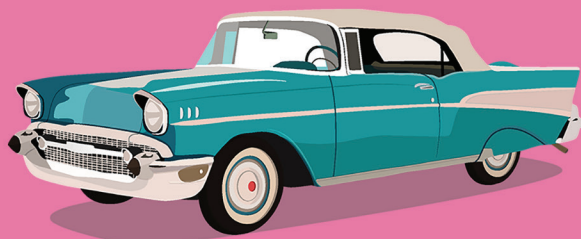

The concert was recorded on November 16, 1970 at the Royal Festival Hall in London. Suave and tuxedo-clad, Sinatra was in top form. He performed two full shows that evening and the second one was filmed.

Sinatra was introduced on stage by Grace Kelly. Kelly had starred alongside Sinatra in *HIGH SOCIETY* (1956), the last film she made before her marriage to Rainier III, Prince of Monaco. At Sinatra's invitation, Princess Grace had stepped in as a last-minute replacement for Noël Coward, who was originally supposed to introduce Sinatra, but had been taken ill (Sinatra visited him in hospital during his time in London).

Sinatra had been balding for many years, which explained all the hats on his publicity stills and album covers. It was forbidden for directors to photograph him from the back.

However, at this concert, Sinatra had completed a very successful hair transplant and deliberately turned his back on the main audience a couple of times to acknowledge the audience sitting at the rear of the stage, along with running his hand over the back of his head to draw attention to his new hair.

The concert features Sinatra classics such as *Pennies From Heaven*, *I've Got You Under My Skin*, *My Kind of Town*, *My Way*, and a rendition of George Harrison's love song *Something* in the way only Sinatra could deliver it.

Sinatra closed the Royal Festival Hall concert with *My Way*, a show-stopping anthem he recorded in the studio only two years earlier, but which quickly became a key part of his repertoire.

## HARRIET TUBMAN VISIONS OF FREEDOM

Tuesday, October 4 – 10pm

Born "Araminta" in 1822 to an enslaved couple on Maryland's Eastern Shore, Harriet Tubman learned quickly about the cruelty of life as a slave. By the time she was 5, her duties included catching muskrats in the swamps, cleaning the slaveowner's house and babysitting their colicky infant. Each time the baby cried, Tubman would be whipped.

Around age 13, Tubman suffered a blow that would forever change her life. When an overseer threw a heavy weight at an enslaved boy, the weight instead hit Tubman. Her skull was fractured, and from that day forward, she suffered from seizures and horrific headaches. During these episodes, she would have visions, which she understood as signposts from her God.

After she regained her health, she offered her owner, Edward Brodess, a deal—she would pay him a yearly fee for the privilege of hiring herself out to masters of her own choosing. In 1849, Brodess died, leaving his widow deeply in debt. After watching the widow sell one group of enslaved people at auction, Tubman decided to run, leaving behind everything.

"There was one or two things I had a right to, liberty or death. If I could not have one, I would have the other," said Tubman.

After she escaped, Tubman chose to help free as many people as she could, making at least 13 secret missions into slave-holding Maryland and using every tool at her disposal. These journeys were made possible by the loose-knit secret network of ordinary people called the Underground Railroad. Her vision of freedom helped hundreds of African Americans escape enslavement.

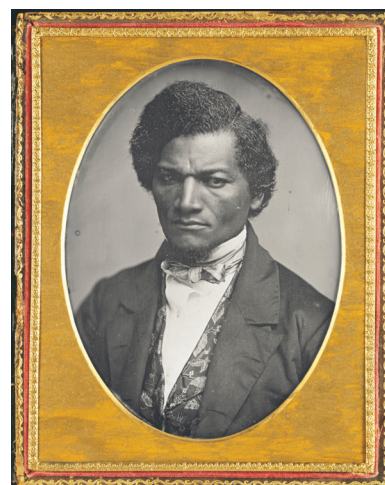

## BECOMING FREDERICK DOUGLASS

Tuesday, October 11 – 10pm

Born in 1818 in Maryland, Frederick Douglass escaped from slavery in 1838 and went on to become many things: abolitionist, autobiographer, essayist, diplomat, orator, editor, philosopher, political theorist, newspaper publisher and social reformer. And considering his trajectory — from enslaved to elder statesman — he was arguably the most accomplished man of his time.

For decades, Douglass was the most famous Black person in the world. More Americans heard him speak than any other contemporary, with the possible exception of Mark Twain. His lectures and speeches were so eloquent and persuasive that some called him a fraud, finding it difficult to believe he had ever been enslaved. To prove his claims, Douglass wrote his first autobiography, *Narrative of the Life of Frederick Douglass, An American Slave*. Published in 1845, it made its author a celebrity. But fame brought with it the threat of capture, so Douglass embarked on a lecture tour throughout the United Kingdom in 1845. His devoted English supporters warmly welcomed him, ultimately negotiating and purchasing his freedom in 1846. Douglass was able to return to the United States a free man.

Compared to his abolitionist peers, Douglass was an uncompromising and relentless campaigner for Black equality. Confined by white abolitionists to a narrow role of telling his story repeatedly to the public, Douglass broke away to express his own political ideas. He began publishing his antislavery newspaper, *The North Star*, in 1847. "To have a newspaper was to be the shaper of public opinion," said historian Derrick Spire. "Founding the newspaper is sort of like Douglass's declaration of intellectual and activist independence."

Despite the extensive written and photographic record of his life, there remains much to be discovered about Frederick Douglass, both the man and his legacy.

# THE U.S. AND THE HOLOCAUST

The new three-part documentary explores America's response to one of the greatest humanitarian crises in history. Inspired in part by the United States Holocaust Memorial Museum's "Americans and the Holocaust" exhibition and supported by its historical resources, the film examines the rise of Hitler and Nazism in Germany in the context of global antisemitism and racism, the eugenics movement in the United States and race laws in the American south. The series, written by Geoffrey Ward, sheds light on what the U.S. government and American people knew and did as the catastrophe unfolded in Europe.

Combining the first-person accounts of Holocaust witnesses, survivors and interviews with leading historians and writers, THE U.S. AND THE HOLOCAUST dispels competing myths that Americans either were ignorant of the unspeakable persecution that Jews and other targeted minorities faced in Europe or that they looked on with callous indifference. The film tackles a range of questions that remain essential to our society today, including how racism influences policies related to immigration and refugees, as well as how governments and people respond to the rise of authoritarian states that manipulate history and facts to consolidate power.

"History cannot be looked at in isolation," said Ken Burns. "While we rightly celebrate American ideals of democracy and our history as a nation of immigrants, we must also grapple with the fact that American institutions and policies, like segregation and the brutal treatment of indigenous populations, were influential in Hitler's Germany. And it cannot be denied that, although we accepted more refugees than any other sovereign nation, America could have done so much more to help the millions of desperate people fleeing Nazi persecution."

Each episode immediately repeats at 10:15pm following the initial airing.

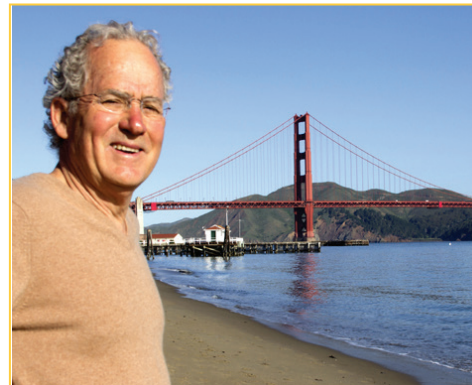
