

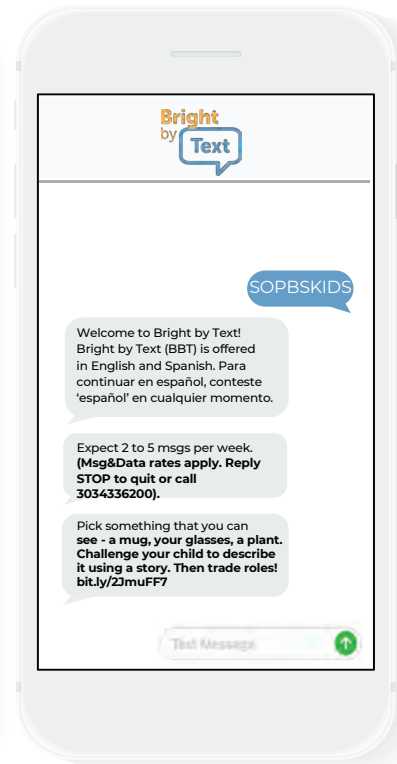

In 2017, Lostine Canyon was the #1 priority among the newly designated "Communities at Risk," located in the Wildland-Urban Interface (WUI) areas identified by Wallowa County. Upon learning they were living in an extreme wildfire risk community, the Lostine Canyon Community recognized early on that wildfire does not adhere to our ownership boundaries and something must be done at a community scale.

This Oregon-produced documentary is about the creation of the Lostine Valley Firewise Community — neighbors helping neighbors. This rural and diverse community was able to come together as a group of determined and dedicated land owners and dwellers to think about how they were going to tackle the problem of fire on the landscape — and the fact that they lived in one of the highest wildfire risk areas in the County with few resources to protect themselves.

This film showcases how these preparations played a crucial role when a major wildfire threatened Lostine in 2022. By working together and taking proactive steps, the Lostine community had demonstrably improved their ability to respond to the wildfire threat.

The Lostine Valley Firewise Community was all about the community coming together and utilizing the diverse skill sets that help lower their community wildfire risk. By making small changes to their homes and properties they were able to dramatically improve the chances that home would survive a wildfire. This special documentary film introduces you to the Lostine Firewise Community, its diverse membership, and the changes they made as a community to help their region better mitigate wildfire risk and better protect their homes, families, and friends.

IN THE SHADOW of FAIRVIEW (July 18)

The Fairview was Oregon's primary institution for those with intellectual and developmental disabilities. Residents were officially referred to as inmates for decades, and in 1985, a U.S. Justice Dept. investigation determined residents faced life-threatening conditions.

THE KU KLUX KLAN (July 25)

A powerful force in Oregon politics and social life, the KKK grew almost overnight and seemed to disappear just as quickly.

THE 1934 WATERFRONT STRIKE (Aug 1)

Twelve thousand members of the The International Longshoreman's Association walked off the job demanding better working conditions crippling maritime shipping. Lasting three months, it hit Oregon hard!

JOHNNIE RAY (Aug 8)

Oregon-born, he was one of the biggest pop stars in the world in the early 1950s. His emotional performances thrilled audiences and helped usher in rock and roll (See page 33 for his story).

MARIE EQUI (Aug 15)

Equi was among the early female physicians in Oregon, was a fierce advocate for the working class, lived openly as a lesbian and championed reproductive rights and civil liberties.

OREGON'S POOR FARMS (Aug 22)

The Poor Farms provided food, shelter, and medical services. They became a refuge for the elderly, people with disabilities, or anyone unable to care for themselves. For some residents, it was the only home they ever knew. For others, it was like a prison.

OREGON PIONEERING HEARTS (Aug 29)

In the late '50s, M. Lowell Edwards, and Dr. Albert Starr embarked on an unexpected collaboration that would result in a revolutionary breakthrough in cardiac surgery — the invention of the world's first successful artificial mitral heart valve.

SEA CHANGE: The Gulf of Maine

Three Parts
Premiering Wed, JULY 24 – 10pm

SEA CHANGE explores a body of water that is warming 97 percent faster than the global ocean, and what that means for the Gulf of Maine — for the animals, for the jobs dependent upon it, and the millions of people along its shores — and may serve as a preview of what could happen worldwide due to climate change.

The acclaimed underwater photographer Brian Skerry is a producer of the series, which features his work capturing the beauty of the area in spite of the devastating impact of climate change over the last 40 years. This series is part of a larger project by Skerry to document how warming waters are affecting this unique ecosystem.

The series blends science, exploration, stunning natural history, and stories of human experience, to illuminate how what happens here could have profound global implications. Viewers will encounter the spectacular wilderness and wildlife that still teems in these waters. The series also documents the range of people including scientists, Native Americans, fishers, and entrepreneurs working to reveal the Gulf's complex history and helping to understand what role the ocean plays in all of our lives.

A marine treasure of some 36,000 square miles, the Gulf of Maine stretches from the tip of Cape Cod to Nova Scotia and is more than a thousand feet deep at its lowest point. It courses with cold, nutrient-rich water, mixed by the world's biggest tides. This rich environment feeds a web of over 3,000 species ranging from microscopic plankton to massive right whales.

Millions of people have lived along the Gulf, drawing their sustenance and livelihood from its plentiful depths. It is a seminal body of water, a cradle to ancient peoples, and a lifeline to fragile marine ecosystems. But for all its storied bounty — and because of it — the Gulf is also in peril, with some of its fisheries now depleted to extreme levels.

JOHNNIE RAY

Seventy-three years ago, Oregon farm boy Johnnie Ray shook the music world when he encouraged fans to "let your hair down and go on and cry." In 1951, Ray's breakthrough song "Cry" shot to the top of the Billboard record charts. Within weeks of its release, the song hit No. 1 for both pop and rhythm & blues sales. The record's flip side, "The Little White Cloud That Cried," reached No. 2 on the pop charts. Overnight, the relatively unknown young man from Oregon became a jukebox sensation and one of the first teen idols.

"He kind of exploded with 'Cry,'" says Ray's friend and last manager, Alan Eichler. "He had all of these hits. He was a big star, and he played the big nightclubs. He had a few scandals along the way, but his stardom was huge."

Ray told reporters that he felt isolated from an early age, partly due to undiagnosed hearing loss. He received his first hearing aid as a young teenager and started singing professionally soon after. In 1941, he began appearing on the Portland radio show "Stars of Tomorrow" along with future actress Jane Powell. Over the next few years, he sang for local war bond drives and played for tips in regional bars. All the time, he was also writing music.

In his early 20s, he made his way to Detroit's Flame Showbar. The club featured some of the era's hottest jazz and rhythm and blues acts. Ray performed with legendary musicians like Ruth Brown, Laverne Baker, Maurice King, and his hero, Billie Holiday.

"If it hadn't been for the Black community, there really wouldn't be any Johnnie Ray around. At that time, I was supported by virtually all Black people who were my friends. I didn't have any white friends. I was literally fed and clothed and kept in that community."

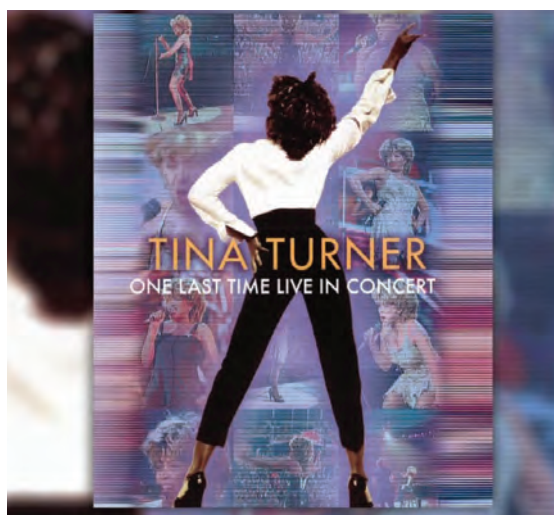

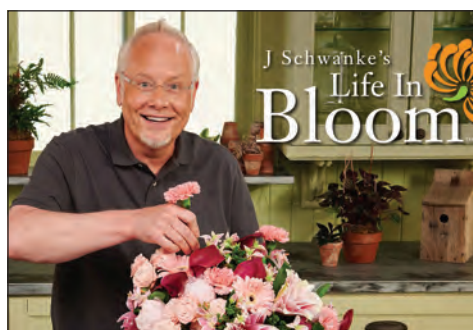
