As of this writing (April 12), we have been unable to reach our transmitter on Mt. Stukel and translator on Soda Mountain due to above average snowfall. We apologize for the inconvenience this outage caused, but want you to know we are committed to providing service to this region. Your membership and support is so important to the work we do, and your continued patience means so much to us.

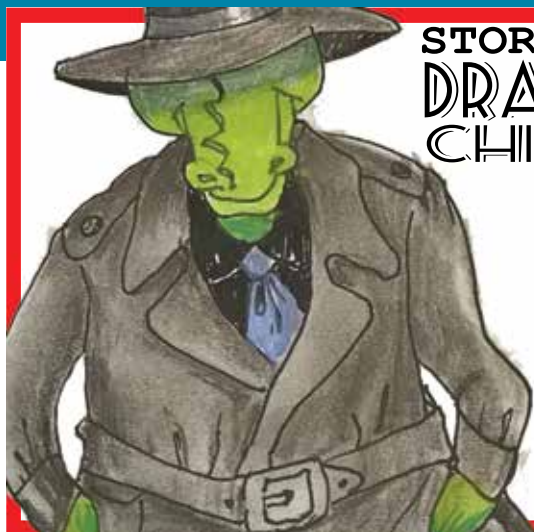
