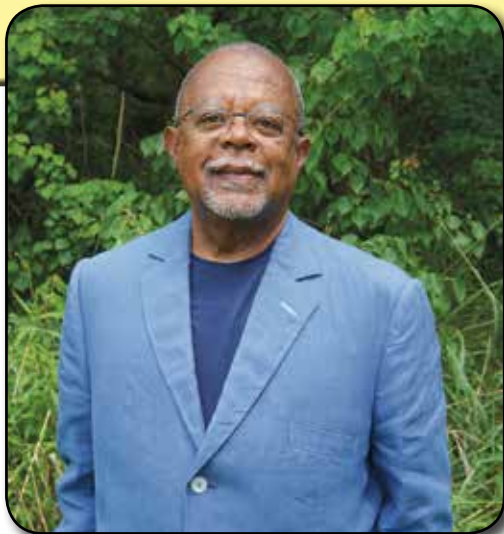

PUBLIC BROADCASTING ON THE CHOPPING BLOCK?

On March 11, I received notice from America's Public Television Stations (APTS) about the President's intention to eliminate federal funding in the federal fiscal budget this fall. Once again the public broadcasting community — television and radio — will need to make the case and justify our existence to the public we serve and to our elected officials.

PBS President and CEO Paula Kerger issued the following comment:

Public broadcasting has earned bipartisan Congressional support over the years thanks to the value we provide to taxpayers. PBS, our member stations and our legions of local supporters will continue to remind leaders in Washington of the significant benefits the public receives in return for federal funding, a modest investment of about \$1.35 per citizen per year, which includes school readiness for kids 2–8, support for teachers and homeschoolers, public safety communications and lifelong learning. PBS is focused on providing high-quality content and universal public service to the American people, which is why we enjoy strong support in every region of the country, in both rural and urban areas, and across the political spectrum.

In a soon to be released study, Americans named PBS and member stations “#1 in public trust” among nationally known institutions. The national online poll, conducted in January 2018 by Marketing & Research Resources Inc., revealed that Americans rank PBS and member stations second only to the country's military defense in terms of value for taxpayer dollars.

IMPACT ON SOPTV

SOPTV is considered a small station, one of about 45 small stations throughout the country, many of which are licensed to a college or receive state funding. SOPTV relies on federal funding for approximately 37% of its total funding. We raise the balance (63%) through annual contributions, membership drives, local underwriting of programming, and grants. Losing federal funding would be nearly impossible to recover from.
