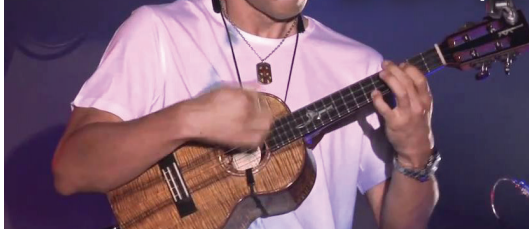

PLANNING FOR OUR FUTURE

School may be just getting back in session, but education never stops at Southern Oregon Public Television! I have had the honor and privilege of attending two amazing education events this summer, both with national scope. These conferences are powerful models for staff development, but also for digging in and finding new ways to advance our education program here in Southern Oregon.

I attended the Public Media Development and Marketing Conference (PMDMC) in early July in Dallas, Texas, which is a national conference focused on marketing and development functions in stations, large and small. While there, I was able to meet with several other development officers doing work to support education at their stations as part of the Teacher Community Program Grant.

Later in July, our CEO Mark Stanislawski, our Education Coordinator Ben Garcia and I flew to Washington, DC, where we met at PBS to engage in a two-day intensive strategy session on developing our education model (which is unique in our region supporting digital and media literacy). If you look over to Ben's column this month, you'll see a good example of the learning models which include definitions and examples of program logic models, and incredible outcomes

from Ben's work with **ScratchJr**. The trip was a wonderful experience, both to get to see PBS, and to visit our nation's Capital. The PBS staff was warm and welcoming, and they provided an ideal location to plan for our station's future.

I returned to SOPTV filled with ideas and inspiration, both to support education and our local programming. With the strides we are making with education here at the station, including a Student Reporting Lab, our **ScratchJr** storytelling training, and our growing relationship with the Communications and Digital Cinema programs at Southern Oregon University, we have a wonderful and synergistic relationship between creators of content and educators. This helps us cover stories worth telling and provides training and job preparation for students in our region.

Your support of education here at SOPTV is vital to our growth, and to our vision of a region filled with storytellers. There are so many ways to support this initiative—from your ongoing membership to a major gift donation to our education fund to a bequest. If you'd like to learn more about the education initiatives here at SOPTV, I would be happy to schedule a tour and meetings with our staff. We might even make some stories together!

Continued Education: A Look at the Program Logic Model

As I have worked to develop and hone SOPTV's Education strategy, I was excited to learn about Program Logic Models, specifically because developing our station's education logic model will more keenly guide our work and impact the education community in Southern Oregon.

What's a program logic model? In a nutshell, it is a short form way to explain the relationships among resources, activities, outputs, and outcomes of a program or project.

Logic models initially start with consideration of outputs, which are usually based on needs. Via two years of work with teachers and students, SOPTV Education has discovered that media arts training and support are a huge need in our teacher community.

Next, resources are considered. In our case those resources are things like a traveling class set of iPads; film production equipment; Adobe software; and PBS' educational resources. As the Education Coordinator organizing and leading professional development trainings, I'm also considered a resource.

Next up are activities. Activities are what we do with these educational resources. As mentioned in my last article, we are refining important activities in the classroom, including *ScratchJr* coding-to-production training with upper elementary students; news making training with middle school students via PBS NewsHour Student Reporting Labs (SRL) curriculum; and advanced SRL training and filmmaking training with high school students. I co-teach these learning activities and in the last year about 200 students and 30 teachers have been reached.

Outcomes are the final part of the program logic model and my favorite concept. Here at SOPTV Education, I have seen that

short-term results of our digital storytelling work with media teachers and students leads to increased video production knowledge and skills. I have observed consistent changes in behavior due to our work, as well. For example, a local elementary student with chronic absenteeism started to come to school because of my weekly *ScratchJr* coding-to-production training. His teacher told him he could join our pilot group if his attendance improved, and by the end of the year it was north of 80%. This is an incredible result!

I have also experienced meaningful changes in condition or quality of life for a local high school video teacher who was unsatisfied with the trajectory of his video program. In addition to our work in the classroom, he and I developed a media arts Professional Learning Community of local media arts professors and media arts teachers in his district. By the end of the school year, he was optimistic about the trajectory of his video program.

We look forward to reporting more outcomes in the upcoming school year as our SOPTV Education program logic model continues to mature and address real needs in our community.

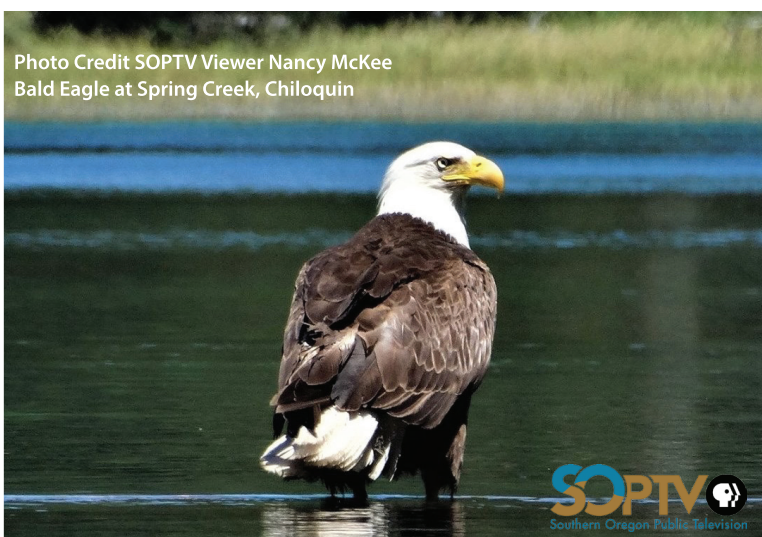


CODING APP FOR CHILDREN



AMERICAN MASTERS Raúl Juliá

Fri, Sept. 27 - 10pm

A warm and revealing portrait of the charismatic actor's journey from his native Puerto Rico to the creative hotbed of 1960s New York City, to prominence on Broadway and in Hollywood. Filled with passion, determination and joy, Juliá's brilliant and daring career was tragically cut short by his untimely death 25 years ago, at age 54.

Told in his own voice through archival interviews and in the words of those who knew him best, the film traces Juliá's personal and professional life while showcasing performances from his collaboration with Joseph Papp's The Public Theater to his successful cinematic career. He acted in starring roles in TWO GENTLEMEN OF VERONA with Clifton Davis, THE TAMING OF THE SHREW with Meryl Streep, THE THREEPENNY OPERA, the Broadway musical NINE, and films such as KISS OF THE SPIDER WOMAN, MOON OVER PARADOR, ROMERO, PRESUMED INNOCENT, and THE ADDAMS FAMILY.

Ever-present throughout Juliá's story is the cultural landscape of the entertainment world and the boundaries he broke. Before diversity and inclusion efforts were part of the national conversation, the big man with the engaging personality and accent was able to amass a varied body of timeless work that helped pave the way for Latino actors today. He was also a passionate and pioneering advocate of social causes, including ending hunger. In Juliá's words, "It's all done within a context of love. That's the beauty of it, you see?"

Topics to be explored include how decades-old research on human behavior shows that social media's addictive power is by design rather than chance; why half a million children still have dangerously high lead levels even though it was banned from gasoline and household products decades ago; how the sex education policies of today are informed by failures of programs created during the Clinton era; and why mandatory arbitration agreements enacted on Wall Street 20 years ago have negatively impacted today's #MeToo movement.

Episode 2 Learn about DNA clues, robot ambivalence, thalidomide, obsessive gamers, and Andy Borowitz on no news.

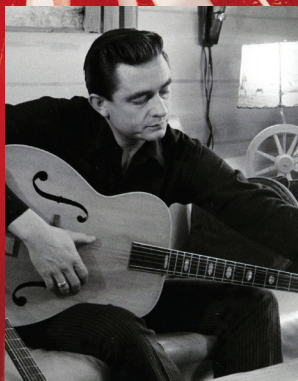

COUNTRY MUSIC

A FILM BY KEN BURNS

Sun., Sept. 15 - Wed., Sept. 18 @ 8pm

*"At the heart of every great country music song is a story," said Ken Burns.
"As the songwriter Harlan Howard said, 'It's three chords and the truth.'"*

Step back in time and journey through the compelling story of a truly American art form. Written by Dayton Duncan, who also wrote the illustrated companion book (coming from Alfred A. Knopf on September 10), chronicles country music's early days, from southern Appalachia's songs of struggle, heartbreak and faith to the rollicking Western swing of Texas, California's honky-tonks and Nashville's "Grand Ole Opry."

"We discovered that country music isn't—and never was—one type of music; it actually is many styles," said Duncan. "It sprang from diverse roots, and it sprouted many branches. What unites them all is the way the music connects personal stories and elemental experiences with universal themes that every person can relate to. And as it evolved, from the bottom up, it created a special bond between the artists and fans that is unique among all other musical genres."

COUNTRY MUSIC digs deep to uncover the roots of the music, including ballads, minstrel music, hymns and the blues, and its early years in the 1920s, when it was called "hillbilly music," and was recorded for the first time and played across the airwaves on radio station barn dances. It explores how Hollywood B movies instituted the fad of singing cowboys like Gene Autry and shows how the rise of juke joints after World War II changed the musical style by bringing electric and pedal steel guitars to the forefront.

The film witnesses the rise of bluegrass music with Bill Monroe and reveals how one of country music's offspring — rockabilly — evolved

into rock and roll in Memphis. The focus is on the constant tug of war between the desire to make country music as mainstream as possible and the periodic reflexes to bring it back to its roots.

At the film's heart are the stories of unforgettable songs and the artists who created them: their emergence from humble beginnings, their musical influences, and their breakthrough moments. The film explores the extraordinary connection between country music artists and fans and notes the enduring influence of particular songs and musicians across generations. The narrative ends in the mid-1990s as a young Garth Brooks emerges from a small venue in Nashville to achieve phenomenal success, brings country music to an entirely new level of popularity, and yet shows up to sign autographs for more than 20 hours at the Country Music Association's Fan Fair.

Duncan, Burns and co-producer Julie Dunfey spent eight years researching and producing the film, conducting interviews with more than 100 people, including 40 members of the Country Music Hall of Fame (17 of those interviewed have since passed on). Among those storytellers are historian Bill Malone and a wide range of country artists such as Marty Stuart, Rosanne Cash, Vince Gill, Reba McEntire, Merle Haggard, Dolly Parton, Willie Nelson, Dwight Yoakam, Emmylou Harris, Kris Kristofferson, and Naomi and Wynonna Judd, as well as studio musicians, record producers and others. The film uses more than 3,200 photographs and over two hours of archival footage, including rare and never-before-seen photos and footage of Jimmie Rodgers, Johnny Cash, and others.

"We will be featuring local musical acts/genres (bands, soloists, duets, choirs, instrumental, a cappella and dancers) ages 4-25 years old," according to Desiree Byrne, CELEBRATION OF MUSIC spokeswoman.

Interested performers need to enter by submitting performance videos to the CELEBRATION OF MUSIC website (see address below). There is no fee to enter or participate.

The local CELEBRATION OF MUSIC winner will be announced at Ethan Bortnick's Wednesday, September 25th concert at The Rogue Theater in Grants Pass.

The local winner will then be invited to participate in the national public television program production of CELEBRATION OF MUSIC in Los Angeles where their talent will be showcased in front of music industry partners, well-known managers, record label executives and choreographers. The national winner will also get to record a single for iTunes (or record a music video for YouTube with Ethan if they are a dancer).

The CELEBRATION OF MUSIC concept was inspired by Ethan Bortnick and his desire to give young musicians and dancers the same opportunities PBS afforded him. "I am honored that I was given the opportunity by PBS television stations across the country to share my music with millions and now with this television program and national tour, I hope that we can find other young musicians and artists and give them a platform to share their talent."

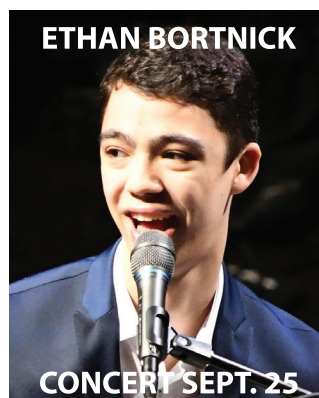
