

TOWARD THE SOURCE: An Arctic Odyssey

Norton Smith of Talent, Oregon, is the producer of a new film, making its broadcast debut on Southern Oregon PBS this September. In the film, titled TOWARD THE SOURCE, Smith takes a solo canoe journey, going up the Yellowknife River into the Canadian arctic. Spanning over 55 days, Smith packed food, survival gear and camera equipment more than 100 miles upriver while shooting his film. The film covers the natural beauty he was immersed in, as well as the spiritual connections he made on this journey.

"In previous solo trips, I'd kept a journal and took a lot of pictures. I had published some of those on my website and got a very favorable reaction," said Smith. "It seemed like it was both an inspiration and a pleasure for people to see that and to follow along vicariously. I wanted to do something that gave a more realistic picture of what these solo journeys were like."

From Jesus to Christ: The First Christians

Fri, Sept 4 – 12am; Sat, Sept 5 – 10am

Drawing upon sometimes controversial historical evidence and interviews with leading New Testament scholars, this award-winning four-hour documentary explores the life of Jesus and the movement he started, challenging familiar assumptions and conventional notions about the origins of Christianity.

“FRONTLINE presents the real story of the rise of Christianity, challenging and upsetting conventional ideas,” said FRONTLINE executive producer David Fanning. “It is not a story of a golden age of consensus, but a story of people in conflict — wrestling with Judaism, confronting the authority of the empire, and struggling among themselves to understand Jesus’ message about the coming of God.”

In the Roman province of Judea, around the fourth year of the rule of Pontius Pilate, a man was led outside the walls of the city of Jerusalem to his execution.

The product of a suburban village, who nevertheless had been exposed to the cosmopolitan life of Roman cities, Jesus of Nazareth grew up in a hotbed of radicalism and political activism, eventually becoming a preacher. His message was characterized by simple metaphor and targeted at an agrarian populace.

To the authorities, however, he was a politically dangerous social reformer whose message about the coming of the “Kingdom of God” was a threat to the peace of Rome. Yet it was his death that would become one of the most important events in human history.
