CALL THE MIDWIFE Season 9
Premieres SUN, March 29 - 8pm

Season 9 takes our favorite nuns and midwives into the mid-1960s. Budgets are being cut, and hospitals reorganized. Terraced houses are being demolished, and traditional family structures torn apart. There are wrecking balls everywhere, and it's up to Sister Julienne, and the midwives and medics of Nonnatus House, to help find a way out of the rubble. When they themselves come under threat, their job becomes even harder.

As 1965 rolls by, we see the team dealing with cases involving cancer, diphtheria, dementia, fistula, and homelessness. They are faced with loneliness among the elderly, the traumas of an exhausted carer, and the defiant behavior of a young and vulnerable prostitute. They deliver more babies born out of wedlock, care for a couple whose beloved infant dies, and support a brave and beautiful new mother who is blind. Meanwhile the Turner's own family comes under threat, Lucille's romance does not run smooth, and Sister Julienne is driven to take an extraordinary step.

There is also a posse of visiting medical students, a fashion show in which Trixie wears the shortest miniskirt ever seen in Poplar, a Horticultural Extravaganza which tests Fred to the limit, and a firework display with a lot of toffee apples. Life, in some ways, has never been sweeter. But time and again, we see our beloved regulars patching over the gaps in the system with ingenuity, kindness and - that eternal, priceless, beautiful thing - their care.

Helen Hunt, Sean Bean, Lesley Manville and Jonah Hauer-King head an international cast in a gripping World War II drama hailed as “an epic war saga with a difference” (*The Mail on Sunday, London*). Set in Britain, Poland, France, Germany and the United States, the events of this seven-hour series take place during the first year of the war. **World on Fire** traces the interweaved fates of several families in 1939 and 1940, from the Nazi invasion of Poland, to the near debacle at Dunkirk, to the fall of Paris and beyond.

MASTERPIECE Executive Producer Rebecca Eaton said, “At the very heart of any war are the families affected by it. **World on Fire** follows the fates of five characters as their stories weave in and out of each other’s. Love, death, heroism, and forgiveness bind them together as the world changes around them.”

Hunt plays Nancy Campbell, an American journalist whose inspiration was a combination of two real-life journalists: William Shirer, who did daily broadcasts and kept diaries during wartime, and British war correspondent Claire Hollingwood, who actually did see Nazi tanks gather on the Polish border. When the real Hollingwood reported what she saw to the British Embassy, they discounted her claim and ignored her warning. Hunt said she read Shearer’s diary to prepare for the role.

Executive producer and writer Peter Bowker was fascinated by the 1970s documentary **World at War** and how that documentary provided inspiration for **World on Fire** as they attempted to make a fictional version that provided various perspectives on the war as that documentary did. “Television had changed and people were investing more in longform series – it seemed like a good time to tell something novelistic in its sweep,” Bowker noted.

All over Europe, no one can quite believe that their normal lives, their everyday pleasures and worries, are about to be demolished. World War II encompassed millions of people and millions of individuals’ stories. **World on Fire** makes this wholesale tragedy achingly personal and, at times, heroic.
