SO PBS EDUCATION & THE PANDEMIC

With the declaration of a world pandemic in March of 2020, education and every normal facet of human activity was turned on its ear. Educators were sent scrambling to come up with effective and useful techniques to ensure students still had access to fair and equitable education. At one point in April, experts estimated that 90 percent of the world's students were out of school. Parents were suddenly pulled into the educational arena as their children's primary instructors, and students were thrust into completely different educational models of learning.

When it was announced that Oregon schools were closing, Southern Oregon PBS flew into action. In addition to dedicating daytime hours to educational programs on the SO PBS World channel, the station pivoted from their PBS NewsHour Student Reporting Labs (SRL) partnership with the Medford School District to help produce and air telecourses with Medford teachers, helping diversify education options for students with limited internet access or computer skills. Led by Ben Garcia and his Hedrick Middle School SRL teaching partner Ivan Olinghouse, the telecourses gave young students options for distance learning, and helped older students receive instruction.

For Southern Oregon PBS, the ability to film these lessons for the community started four years ago, when the station received a grant to help teachers. The Teacher Community Program (TCP) grant rebooted SO PBS's education program, led for the last four years by Education Coordinator, Ben Garcia.

Though the station had sponsored a "Ready To Learn" education initiative in the years before the Teacher Community Grant, there was not an active education program at Southern Oregon Public Television when Ben arrived.

"I was hired at the end of the 2017 school year, and it was difficult to hit the ground running because most teachers were about to go on summer break," remembers Garcia. "There were two teachers who wanted to work on a summer project: Robert Harrison (McLoughlin Middle School) who wanted help writing

a lesson plan; and a Cliff Cowley (Hedrick Middle School) who wanted help with coordination and instruction at the Young Writer's Camp.

I ended up starting a LatinX writers camp sub-camp that summer. My foray into PBS LearningMedia, and YWP began with these two initiatives."

Ben's work, which he built from the ground up, has covered much of the station's viewing area and addressed a number of topics. His first order of business was to assess where and what teachers' needs were in our community.

"In collaboration with PBS Education TCP grant folks, and our contracted researcher (Rockman et al), we found out that local teachers had a mountain of needs," said Garcia. "One person could not possibly address all of these needs. A great debate started about whether I should develop experimental models of teacher engagement based on needs that were not being addressed by local schools, or whether I should focus on PBS educational products. I tried a blend of both."

In his first full school year, Ben developed an array of projects designed to meet the needs of our area's teachers. These projects consisted of hosting teacher workshops, developing Professional Learning Communities (PLCs), teacher support groups, collaborating on lesson plans, and developing a media arts professional learning network.

After gauging his successes and listening to the feedback of the grant administrator, Ben began to narrow the focus of his work during the fall of 2018.

"We were asked to focus on one model of teacher engagement, and make it our own. I narrowed my focus to PBS Kids ScratchJr coding and PBS NewsHour Student Reporting Labs. When administrators and teachers began to show more interest in Student Reporting Labs, I focused all of my energy on that."

PBS NewsHour Student Reporting Labs is a program designed to introduce students to the tenets of video production and journalism. The project is described on The PBS NewsHour's website as connecting "students with a network of public broadcasting mentors and an innovative journalism curriculum to develop digital media, critical thinking, and communication skills while producing original news reports."

With SRLs in place at two Medford schools, Ben brings his connection to public media into local classrooms to teach the critical skills needed for developing news reports about issues and topics that touch us all. And because he was in local schools helping teachers when the pandemic hit, he was positioned to immediately begin helping meet their new needs.

While plans for the fall semester remain uncertain, Southern Oregon PBS will be there to help and assure the students of our community have access to the resources they need.

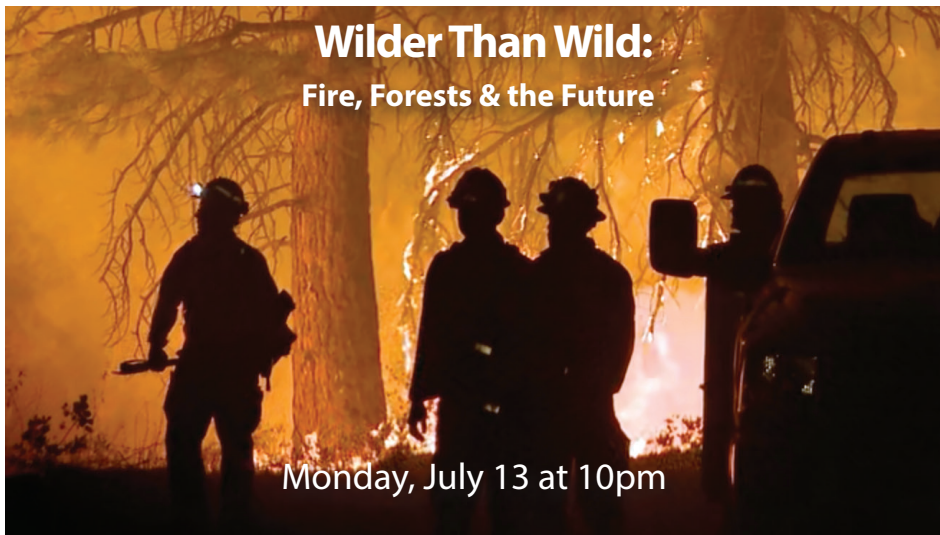

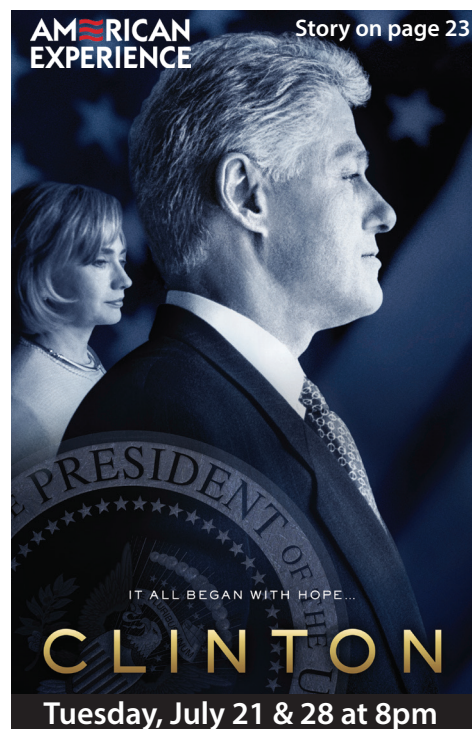

WE ARE THE RADICAL MONARCHS

Mon, July 20 at 10pm

A group of tween girls chant into megaphones, marching in the San Francisco TransMarch. Holding clenched fists high, they wear brown berets and vests showcasing colorful badges like "Black Lives Matter" and "Radical Beauty." Meet the Radical Monarchs, a group of young girls of color at the front lines of social justice.

Set in Oakland, a city with a deep history of social justice movements, the film documents the Radical Monarchs - an alternative to the Scout movement for girls of color, aged 8-13. Its members earn badges for completing units on social justice including being an LGBTQ ally, the environment, and disability justice. The group was started by two, fierce, queer women of color, Anayvette Martinez and Marilyn Hollinquest, as a way to address and center her daughter's experience as a young brown girl. Their work is anchored in the belief that adolescent girls of color need dedicated spaces and that the foundation for this innovative work must also be rooted in fierce inter-dependent sisterhood, self-love, and hope.

The multiple award-winning documentary follows the first troop of Radical Monarchs for over three years, until they graduate, and documents the Co-Founders struggle to respond to the needs of communities across the US and grow the organization after the viral explosion of interest in the troop's mission to create and inspire a new generation of social justice activists.

In the tradition of the American Experience President's series, Clinton provides a balanced, honest, intimate look of the 42nd president's life, career and legacy.

The documentary tells the story of a president who rose from a broken childhood in Arkansas to become one of the most successful politicians in modern American history and one of the most complex and conflicted characters to ever stride across the public stage. From draft dodging to the Dayton Accords, from Monica Lewinsky to a balanced budget, the presidency of William Jefferson Clinton veered between sordid scandal and grand achievement.

Clinton had a career full of accomplishment and rife with scandal, a marriage that would make history and create controversy, and a presidency that would define the crucial and transformative period between the fall of the Berlin Wall and 9/11.

A four-hour film, part of the critically acclaimed series of presidential biographies, *Clinton* follows the president across his two terms as he confronted some of the key forces that would shape the future, including partisan political warfare and domestic and international terrorism, and as he struggled with uneven success to define the role of American power in a post-Cold War world. Most memorably, it explores how Clinton's conflicted character made history, even as it enraged his enemies and confounded his friends.

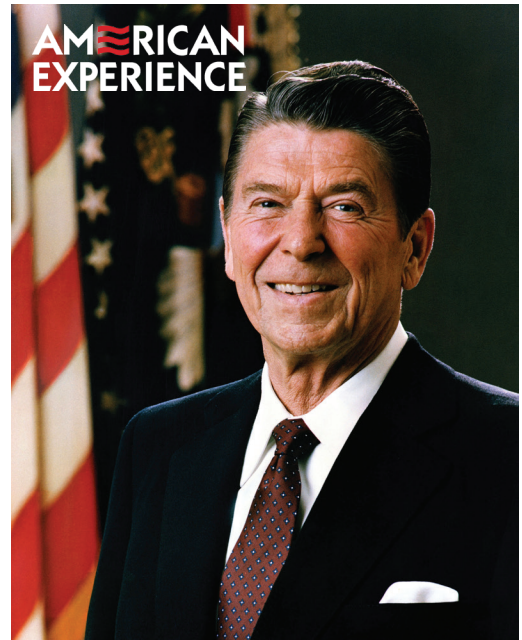

REAGAN

Tues, Aug 4 & 11 - 8pm

On the eve of his election, Ronald Reagan was asked, "What is it, governor, that people see in you?" He responded, "Would you laugh if I told you that they look at me and they see themselves?"

Ronald Reagan was America's most ideological president in his rhetoric, yet pragmatic in his actions. He believed in balanced budgets, but never submitted one; hated nuclear weapons, but built them by the thousands; preached family values, but presided over a dysfunctional family. His vision of America divided the nation, yet no matter what people thought of him politically, Reagan always won them over personally.

A seemingly simple man, Ronald Reagan was consistently underestimated by his opponents; one by one, he overcame them all to become a president who always preferred to see America as a "shining city on a hill."

A look at Reagan's life through the testimony of family, friends, historians, biographers, Reagan was produced with unprecedented access to the Reagan family, including Nancy Reagan and three of Reagan's four children, biographer Edmund Morris and members of Reagan's inner political circle -- his "California Cabinet" -- and his counterparts on the world stage, including former British prime minister Margaret Thatcher and Soviet leader Mikhail Gorbachev.

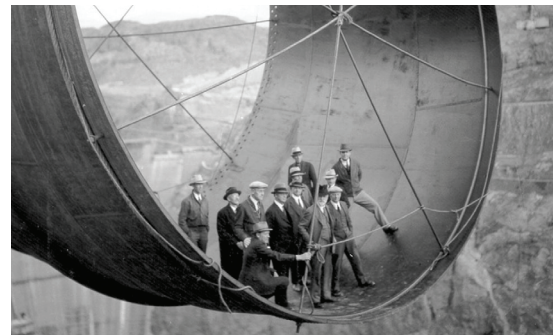

THE VOTE

Premiering Monday & Tuesday, July 6 & 7 @ 9pm

AMERICAN EXPERIENCE

The Vote, a new four-hour, two-part documentary series, tells the dramatic story of the epic — and surprisingly unfamiliar — crusade waged by American women for the right to vote. Focusing primarily on the movement's militant and momentous final decade, the film charts American women's determined march to the ballot box, and illuminates the myriad social, political and cultural obstacles that stood in their path.

The series delves deeply into the controversies that divided the nation in the early 20th century — gender, race, state's rights, and political power — and offers an absorbing lesson in the delicate, often fractious dynamics of social change. Timed to the 100th anniversary of the passage of the 19th Amendment, **The Vote** is narrated by Kate Burton and features the voices of Mae Whitman (Alice Paul), Audra McDonald (Ida B. Wells), Laura Linney (Carrie Chapman Catt) and Patricia Clarkson (Harriot Stanton Blatch), portraying some of the unsung warriors of the movement.

"In 1920, the 19th Amendment to the U.S. Constitution gave women the right to vote." It is an axiom of American history; yet seldom has an axiom more thoroughly obscured reality. Although rightly regarded as a milestone for both American women and American democracy, the 19th Amendment was not quite the simple turning point it is generally perceived to be. Millions of women voted before the amendment and millions more were prohibited from voting after it, particularly African American women in the South. Nor was the ballot a favor bestowed upon women by an enlightened, progressive society. The right to vote was, in fact, fought for and won — by three generations of American women who, over the course of more than seven decades, not only carried out one of the most sustained and successful political movements in all of American history, but were also the first to employ the techniques of nonviolent civil disobedience that later would become the hallmark of American political protest.

From the moment the clamor for woman suffrage first was raised in the United States, in the 1840s, the question was how the vote would ever be won. Resistance to women's participation in the political sphere came

from every quarter of American society — from political machines eager to maintain their power, industrial interests fearful for their profits, even many women, who were convinced that wielding the ballot would somehow diminish their influence in society. Compounding the opposition, from the late 19th century on, was the poisonous legacy of Reconstruction and the determination of the former Confederate states to preserve white supremacy, in large part by barring African Americans from the polls.



As of 1909, despite six decades of relentless struggle, suffragists could point to little in the way of progress. Just four states had extended the franchise to women; the federal woman suffrage amendment — introduced in the Senate in 1878 — had virtually no support on Capitol Hill; and most in the first generation of activists had gone to their graves without casting a ballot. What had begun as a crusade of the few, however, had become a mass movement — and their collective impatience was mounting.

As suffragists attempted to navigate the treacherous shoals of the national political scene, time and again principle was sacrificed in the name of pragmatism. Unfolding after the Civil War, when racism was both "a political fact and a political strategy," says historian Martha Jones, the crusade for woman's suffrage mirrored its historical moment. When expedient, white suffragists proved willing to accommodate its pervasive and deeply pernicious politics of exclusion. **The Vote** engages this troubled history directly — underscoring the contributions of women of color to the struggle, the challenges of coalition-building in a fundamentally unequal society, and most importantly, the significant limitations of the 19th Amendment.

Dramatic and thought-provoking, **The Vote** is, at its core, a story about power — "who has it and who doesn't want to give it up," says constitutional lawyer and writer Michael Waldman. "We're still fighting over who has that power."

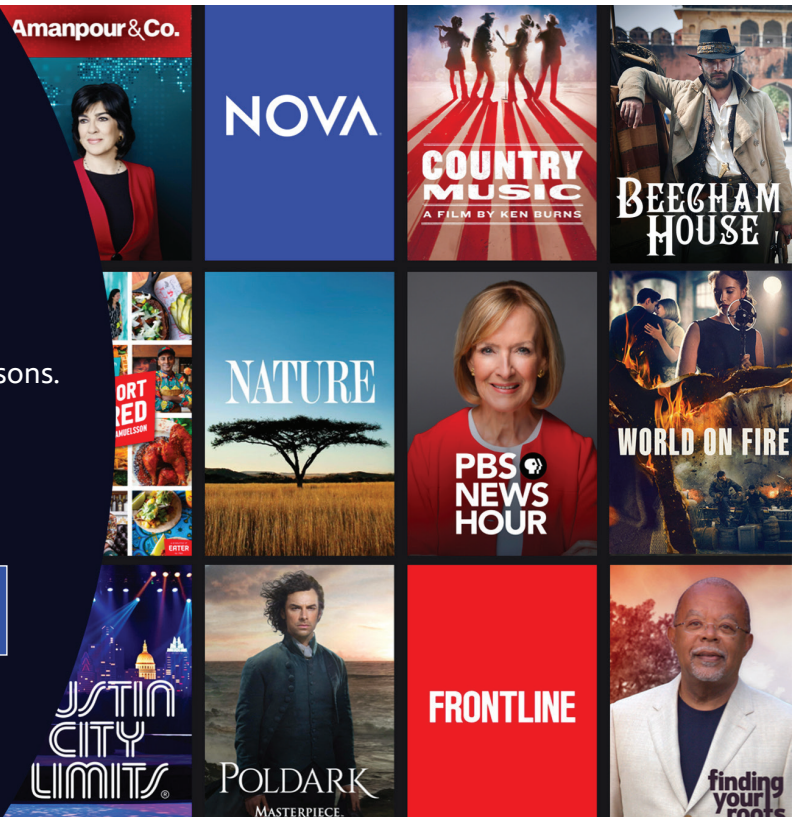
