At home learning has been a difficult adjustment for many families, especially those with younger children who cannot yet read. Online learning is challenging for this age group, and Southern Oregon PBS has been working to provide helpful resources to help bridge this gap in education for young learners.



One of the initiatives from the station includes weekly learning packets for young learners, aged Pre-K-2nd grade. These packets are designed to accompany PBS KIDS shows, and include activities to tie the lessons from the programs into real world examples.

“The PBS Kids Bingo activity packs have been so helpful for our family,” said Wanda, a mother of a kindergartener and a preschooler. “The ideas for these great, educational activities are all put together by age and all I have to do is get everything together. It has definitely helped to relieve some of the stress we have been feeling with regard to education in our household.”

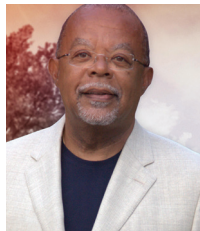

A Pivotal Moment for PBS



President Lyndon B. Johnson signed the Public Broadcasting Act in 1967. This authorized federal operating aid to stations through a new agency, the Corporation for Public Broadcasting. In 1970, PBS began broadcasting.

Here is an excerpt of what President Johnson said at the signing about the spirit of PBS, which holds true today.

"I believe the time has come to stake another claim in the name of all the people, stake a claim based on the combined resources of communications. I believe the time has come to enlist the computer and the satellite, as well as television and radio, and to enlist them in the cause of education.

While we work every day to produce new goods and to create wealth, we want most of all to enrich man's spirit.

[This act] will assist stations and producers who aim for the best in broadcasting good music, in broadcasting exciting plays and in broadcasting reports on the whole fascinating range of human activity. It will try to prove that what educates can also be exciting.

It will get part of its support from our Government. But it will be carefully guarded from Government or from party control. It will be free, and it will be independent – and it will belong to all of our people.

So today we rededicate a part of the airwaves – which belong to all the people – and we dedicate them for the enlightenment of all the people."

Hugh Laurie plays Peter Laurence, a self-made former furniture salesman who has risen to the heights of the British government thanks to a natural gift for populism, and a forceful nature, all while excelling at walking the tightrope of Machiavellian party politics.

As ROADKILL opens, he has just won a libel suit against reporter Charmian Pepper, who accused him of accepting payments to help privatize the National Health Service. Saved from being "roadkill" by his legal team, Peter stays in the good graces of the devious prime minister, who fears his popularity but is aware of the abundant skeletons, both public and private, in his closet.

In a chain of events where everyone seems to be conspiring against him, Peter faces a number of antagonists, including Helen, his loyal wife for three decades, who has lied in court on his behalf but is starting to have second thoughts about their marriage. She is dimly aware of Madeleine, a manuscript librarian, who is Peter's longtime mistress. For her part, Madeleine has grown fed up with their secret life. Peter's two grown daughters are also angry with their father.

Then there is Rochelle Madeley, the barrister who got Peter off. Despite the win, she can't escape the urge to dig deeper into Peter's past. Coming at Peter from the other direction is Joe Lapidus, the newspaper editor who originally unleashed Charmian on him. He hasn't let go of the case either.

No one knows Peter better than his special advisor, Duncan Knock, who wants to ride his boss's coattails to the top. Unfortunately, he starts making decisions that may not be in Peter's best interest. Another subordinate, Dame Vanessa Pollard, begins undermining Peter as soon as he lands in his new ministerial job.

If nothing else, Peter is a survivor—at least so far. Untroubled by guilt or remorse, he seeks to further his own agenda even whilst others plot to bring him down. His motto: "You can get away with anything if you just brazen it out."

Even a despairing prime minister has to concede, "High wire doesn't do it. More like Houdini."

THE RISE OF THE NAZIS

Tuesdays, November 10 – 24 at 9pm

A riveting look at Adolf Hitler's ascent to Führer of the Third Reich. How, in less than four years, did Germany turn from a liberal state into a murderous dictatorship that would soon set the world ablaze?

Focused on the pivotal period between 1930 and 1934, this three-part documentary — as gripping as any fictional thriller — aims "to show how a democracy can unravel," says executive producer Julian Jones, and "to help viewers understand what may have motivated the key players' actions and beliefs."

This cautionary tale is told via astute historians (one notes that a general's name aptly translates as "to sneak" or "to creep"), telling re-creations and a judicious use of chilling archival footage.

In the opener, backroom deals among politicians of the Reich, including WWI hero President Paul von Hindenburg, open the door to one time fringe player Adolf Hitler, who is gaining power as chancellor, and heroic attorney Hans Litten tries to expose the tuggery of the Nazi movement.

Later, we see how Hitler brings all of Germany under Nazi control. Says Jones: "We should not take democracy for granted. It's important we learn from this period of history so we can stop it from ever happening again."

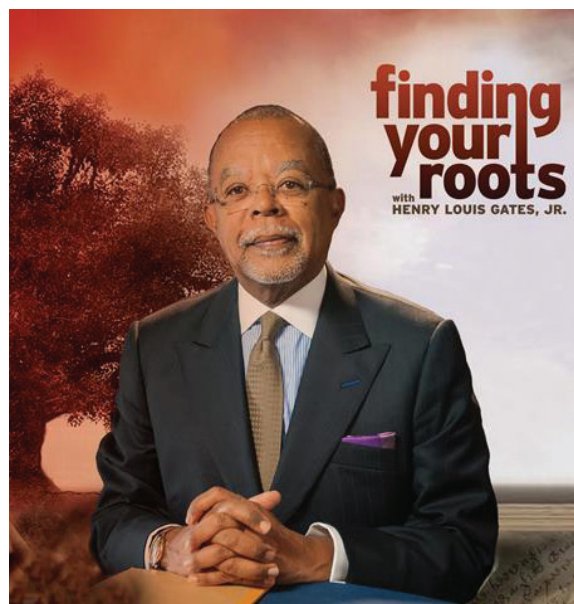

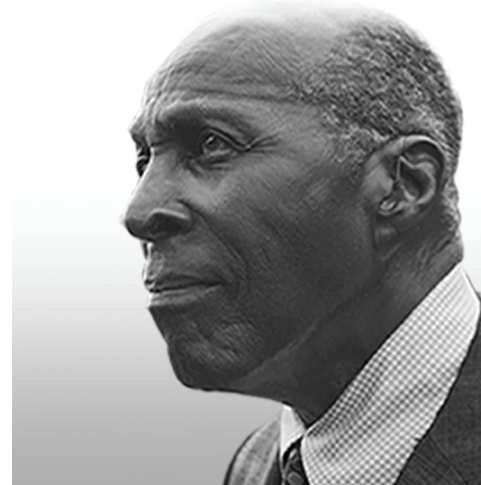

VERNON JORDAN: MAKE IT PLAIN

Mon, Dec 28 – 10:00pm

The one-hour documentary explores Vernon Jordan's rise from the segregated South, his tenure as the head of several civil rights organizations, and his position as a partner at a corporate law firm and financial behemoth. Jordan is one of the most influential African American thought leaders in America. He climbed from modest origins to national renown as a distinguished, pioneering attorney, businessman and civil rights leader; and an influential powerbroker and counselor to American presidents spanning the era from LBJ to Barack Obama.

Through personal recollections, interviews with colleagues, friends and family; access to his social justice work; and archival footage; the documentary tells the story of Jordan's early life in the segregated South and residence in America's first African-American housing project; his service at the nation's leading civil rights organizations and survival of an assassin's bullet, and his success in the corridors of power.

Foremost, the film illuminates Jordan's lifelong dedication and significant contributions to the fight for civil rights and Black economic advancement, including his participation in a lawsuit against the University of Georgia for discriminatory admissions policies; his work as a field director for the NAACP and director of the Voter Education Project; and his leadership of the United Negro College Fund and the National Urban League. Tracking his meteoric rise to power and fortune, and the sacrifices he made along the way, *Vernon Jordan: Make It Plain* follows one man's attainment of the American dream as he achieved success on his own terms.

LAURA INGALLS WILDER: Prairie to Page

Tues, Dec 29 – 8pm

An unvarnished look at the unlikely author whose autobiographical fiction helped shape American ideas of the frontier and self-reliance. A Midwestern farm woman who published her first novel at age 65, Laura Ingalls Wilder transformed her frontier childhood into the best-selling "Little House" series. The documentary delves into the legacy of the iconic pioneer as well as the way she transformed her early life into enduring legend, a process that involved a little-known collaboration with her daughter Rose.

Featuring never-before-published letters, photographs and family artifacts, the film explores the context in which Wilder lived and wrote, as well as the true nature of her personality. The film includes original interviews with writers, actors, historians, scholars and fans.

Wilder has an enduring fanbase — including self-proclaimed Bonnetheads — and the books and TV program loosely based on them have become cultural touchstones. Starting with "Little House in the Big Woods" (1932), the books chronicle the adventures of a family struggling to survive on the American frontier and have inspired four generations with the courage and determination of their heroine. Though Wilder's stories emphasized real life and celebrated stoicism, she omitted the grimmer and contradictory details of her personal history: grinding poverty, government assistance, deprivation and the death of her infant son.

This documentary reveals the truth behind the best-sellers, exploring a rags to riches story that has been embraced by millions of people worldwide.

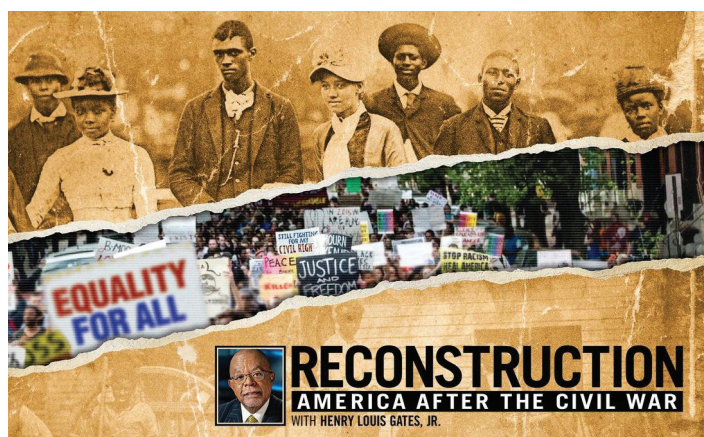

The four-hour series explores the transformative years following the American Civil War, when the nation struggled to rebuild itself in the face of profound loss, massive destruction, and revolutionary social change. The twelve years that composed the post-war Reconstruction era (1865-77) witnessed a seismic shift in the meaning and makeup of our democracy, with millions of former slaves and free black people seeking out their rightful place as equal citizens under the law. Though tragically short-lived, this bold democratic experiment was, in the words of W. E. B. Du Bois, a 'brief moment in the sun' for African Americans, when they could advance, and achieve, education, exercise their right to vote, and run for and win public office.
