Well everyone, we made it through 2020. The past year presented unimagined challenges and hardships for our community and the world. Though our problems aren't over with the switching of the calendar, it is always nice to feel like we have a fresh start.

The start of this year also marks the start of the 50th season of MASTERPIECE THEATRE. MASTERPIECE is one of the crown jewels of PBS' program schedule. Many of you have been watching on Sunday nights since the series debuted on January 10th in 1971 with THE FIRST CHURCHILLS, followed the FORSYTE SAGA, I CLAUDIUS, HENRY VIII, and UPSTAIRS, DOWNSTAIRS (the original DOWNTON ABBEY), and the original POLDARK.

In addition to the programs that we all love, we have come to know the series' hosts as well. British born Alistair Cooke, was the first host of the series, and he also penned his weekly the LETTER FROM AMERICA. Cooke hosted the series from 1971-1992, and we are airing a special program to honor his legacy Sunday, Jan. 10 at 10 pm (THE UNSEEN ALISTAIR COOKE). After Cooke retired, Russell Baker stepped up and served from 1992 to 2004. Several other hosts including Gillian Anderson, Alan Cumming, and Laura Linney have followed.

MASTERPIECE is near and dear to me personally as well. Many years ago, when I was working at WMHT in Albany, New York, we held an event with a reception with Governor Mario Cuomo at the Capitol in Albany. Several members from WGBH (Boston) were in New York City and they asked if they could join our event. We agreed and this was how I got to know Rebecca Eaton, who was the Executive Director at MASTERPIECE from 1985 until she announced her retirement late last year. We had dinner at the Fort Orange Governor Club in Albany. It was quite an experience and I have been able to see Rebecca at PBS meetings many times since. Her husband was also one of my colleagues when I was at PBS in the 1980s.

I hope you all enjoy MASTERPIECE'S 50th season, which looks to be pretty outstanding.

THE UNSEEN ALISTAIR COOKE

Sunday, January 10 at 10pm



Alistair Cooke (1908-2004) was known to millions as the graceful, amazingly well-read host of MASTERPIECE THEATRE for 22 years. But this very public side of a very outgoing man was just the tip of the iceberg to a fascinating career extending back to the Jazz Age.

Cooke, who died in 2004 at age 95, was a polymath, reporter, critic, amateur jazz pianist and tireless explorer of the culture of the United States, where the English-born son of an iron fitter became a citizen in 1941.

THE UNSEEN ALISTAIR COOKE includes footage from 150 reels of film shot by Cooke from the 1930s on, recording his encounters with American scenes and celebrities. Discovered after his death, the treasure trove includes a short feature of his friends Charlie Chaplin and Paulette Goddard in an exuberant playlet filmed aboard Chaplin's yacht. Chaplin had promised to be best man at Cooke's wedding in 1934, but missed the nuptials.

Outside the United States, Cooke is best known as the insightful correspondent on the worldwide BBC radio broadcast, "Letter from America," which aired weekly from 1946 until a month before Cooke's death. Anecdotal and slyly witty, the series had the feel of an old friend reporting the incidents and observations of an eventful life. At times Cooke dwelt on the tragic, as in his account of Robert Kennedy's assassination in 1968, which he witnessed from only a few yards away.

Interviewed in the program are his personal friend Lauren Bacall, MASTERPIECE executive producer Rebecca Eaton, and members of Cooke's family, who recount what it was like living with this flamboyant, if sometimes neglectful, father and husband. "He was the perfect person for the job because he could speak with such knowledge about literature and history," says Eaton. "And since he lived in this country, he knew what Americans needed to know about British society and the finer points of the class system."

"I suspect that over the years people tuned into MASTERPIECE THEATRE as much to see him and hear what he had to say as to watch the programs," she adds. "He became like a rock star."

FERN HOBBS AND THE SNAKE RIVER SHOWDOWN

On New Year's Day 1914 Governor Oswald West sent his private secretary to shut down the lawless town of Copperfield in remote Baker County. What unfolded became one of the most bizarre chapters in Oregon history. The Wild West meets the remarkable Fern Hobbs in this episode of OREGON EXPERIENCE.



Sunday, January 3 at 2:30am (Encore at 6:30pm)

Before the 1969 moon landing, almost all the Apollo astronauts trained in Central Oregon. The area's unique lava formations were thought to resemble the lunar surface. The NASA field trips included Hole in the Ground, Fort Rock, Newberry Volcano, and the McKenzie lava fields, along with other areas. The visits provided valuable training and testing that helped astronauts prepare for visiting the moon. Some of the lunar rocks gathered during the Apollo missions ended up in Oregon universities. They would become a part of breakthrough research that continues to shape our understanding of the solar system.

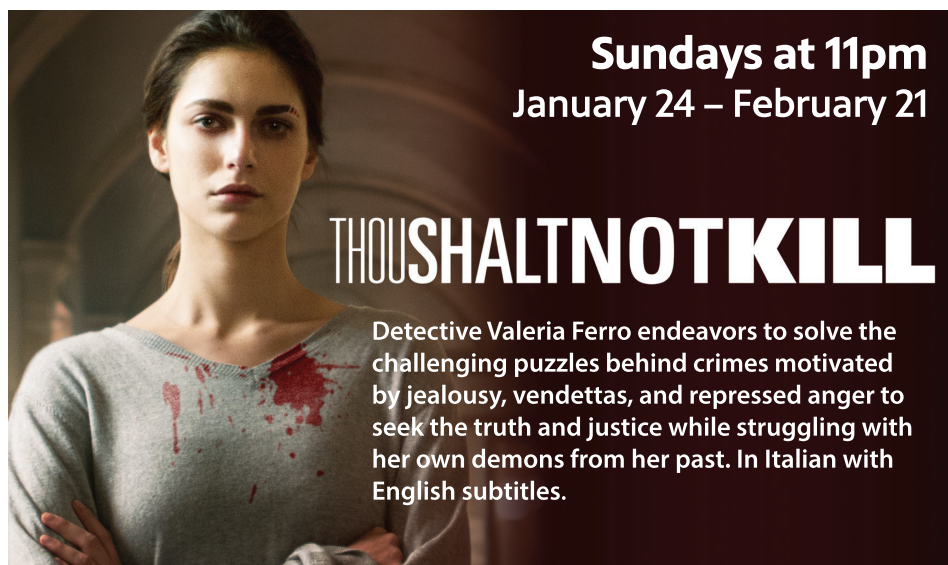

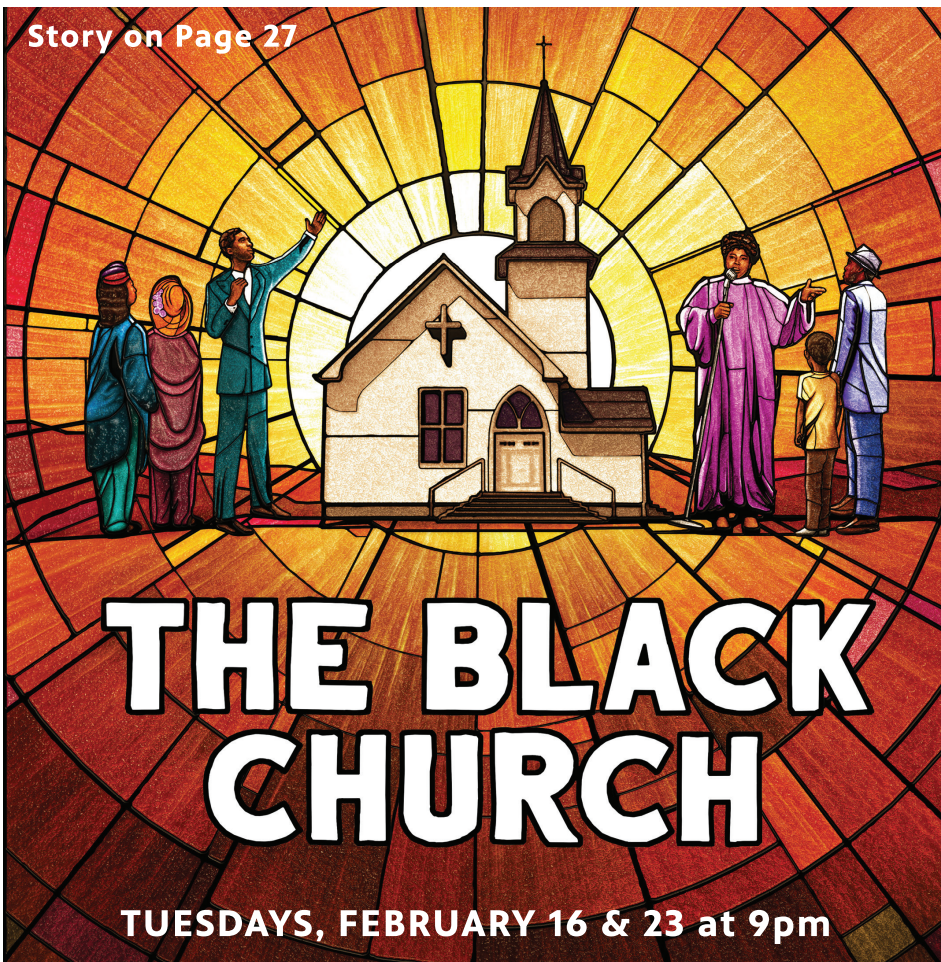

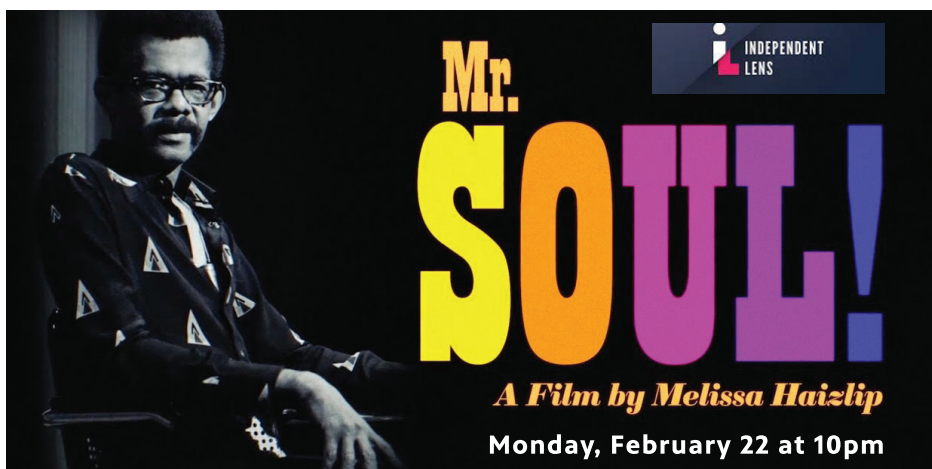

ELIZABETH IS MISSING

Sunday, January 3 at 9pm

Two-time Academy Award®-winner Glenda Jackson stars as a woman desperately trying to solve two mysteries as she declines ever deeper into dementia.

Playing feisty grandmother Maud Horsham who lives alone despite early-stage Alzheimer's, Maud's only friend, Elizabeth, ominously goes missing, leading to one of the mysteries at the heart of the drama.

The other mystery in Maud's mind is a puzzle from her past, kindled when she unearths the top of an old cosmetics compact while gardening with Elizabeth. The discovery takes Maud back to her teenaged self. Like many younger siblings, Maud looked up to her big sister, Sukey, considering her the height of glamour; plus she had a crush on her sister's husband, Frank.

Sukey failed to come home one night in 1949. She was never to be seen again.

As Maud thinks back on it, she wonders if the family's lodger at the time had anything to do with Sukey's vanishing. And the cryptic warnings from the long-ago mad woman with the umbrella only deepen the riddle.

In her increasingly disoriented perception, the disappearances of Sukey and now Elizabeth get mixed up—like the jigsaw puzzle that Maud flings to the floor. She attacks the problem with a system she uses around the house: sticky notes, posted everywhere, documenting daily reminders to herself—mostly about locking the door or turning off the stove, but also recording her meetings with Elizabeth and chance observations. Maud's granddaughter, Katy, helps her arrange the notes. "Imagine you're like a detective looking at clues," Katy says helpfully. "You have to start at the beginning, and you have to be logical."

And she is logical—by her own standards. As memories, clues, and deductions pile up, viewers come to see the world as Maud does, and to solve the mystery as this tenacious, vision-haunted sleuth does.

MISS SCARLET & THE DUKE

Sundays, January 17 – February 21 at 8pm

Lighthearted yet gripping, this 6-part miniseries is set in London at the start of the Sherlock Holmes era, circa 1880. Eliza's father, Henry, is a widowed retired police officer, currently a private detective running up bills and drinking through his occasional earnings. Nonetheless, he is a talented investigator, and he has taught his only child, Eliza, the trade since she was a girl. She is now determined to break into this male-only profession.

Fortunately, Eliza's childhood friend happens to be a detective inspector at Scotland Yard: William "The Duke" Wellington. He gets his nickname from the most famous Englishman of the 19th century: the Duke of Wellington, victor over Napoleon at the Battle of Waterloo. Like that other Wellington, the Duke is cool and decisive in a scrape. And he is also a ladies' man, which leads to interesting complications with Eliza.

Sometimes working together—but often at odds—Eliza and the Duke tackle a series of fascinating cases. On launching her business, Eliza's initial challenge is not criminals or clients so much as getting society to take a female detective seriously, even one who has mastered wounds, poisons, motives, and red herrings. But she forges ahead and sees her first commission—a simple search for an older gentleman's lost niece—turn into something very sinister.

And with that, her career, if not her income, is off and running. Eliza's exploits range from an open-and-shut murder case that only she realizes is not so clear-cut, to a dastardly plot that will make history if it succeeds, to a client being harassed from beyond the grave.

In her final investigation of the season, which spans Episodes 5 and 6, Eliza is pursuing the mystery of her father's demise when she unwittingly lures the Duke into a deathtrap. Naturally, the ordeal is a bonding experience for the two quarrelsome but secretly affectionate crime-solvers.

THE LONG SONG

Sundays, January 31 – February 14 at 10pm

This 3-part miniseries based on Andrea Levy's novel about the end of slavery in Jamaica follows July, an indomitable, young slave who works on a sugarcane plantation with her detestable mistress, Caroline Mortimer. Their lives change with the arrival of the charming new overseer, Robert Goodwin who sets out to improve the plantation for both the slaves and the mistress. Caroline is immediately taken with him, but there is also an attraction between him and July.

"July is a product of quite a lot of trauma," explained Tamara Lawrance who plays July. "She's one of those people who is so strong because of loss and abandonment. She's got a lot of self-confidence and has a high opinion of herself. She thinks that Caroline is an idiot and realises that she's smarter than her and is able to manipulate her. She's got it in her to survive."

While the story is fictional, Lawrance points out that there is an undercurrent of truth thanks to its historical accuracy.

"It doesn't just depict a slave as a character who can endure copious amounts of pain," she says. "The slaves were people who have light and shade as well. It's not just black and white people antagonising each other. There were antagonists within the slave community as well and friendship across the communities. This story shows that through humour and wit."

Episode 1 – In early 1800s Jamaica, Caroline adopts the child slave July as her maid. July grows up to witness the Christmas Rebellion and the radical transformation of her world.

Episode 2 – The handsome overseer Robert arrives, sparking a bitter rivalry between July and her mistress. The field hands rebel against Robert's work demands.

Episode 3 – Facing labor unrest and financial ruin for the plantation, Robert's sanity starts to unravel, with devastating effects on July. Years later, she makes a remarkable discovery.

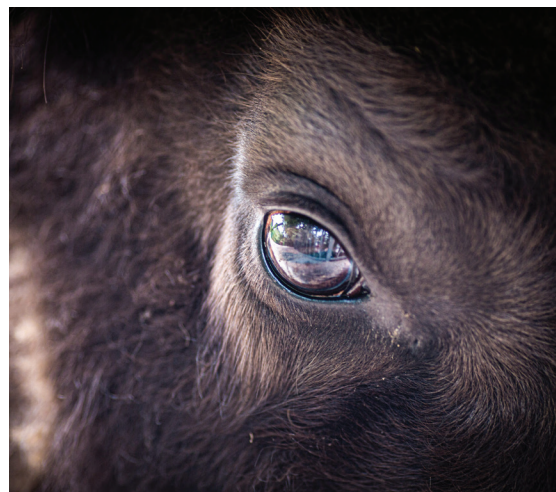

THE BLACK CHURCH: This Is Our Story, This is Our Song

February 16 & 23 at 9pm

Tracing the 400-year-old story of the Black church in America, the 2-part series produced by Henry Louis Gates, Jr, reveals how Black people have worshipped and, through their spiritual journeys, improvised ways to bring their faith traditions from Africa to the New World, while translating them into a form of Christianity that was not only truly their own, but a redemptive force for a nation whose original sin was found in their ancestors' enslavement across the Middle Passage.

Episode 1 explores the roots of African American religion, beginning with the trans-Atlantic slave trade and the extraordinary ways enslaved Africans preserved and adapted their faith practices under the brutal realities of human bondage. As an awakening of Protestant Christianity spread in the 18th century, Black Americans embraced a vision of a liberating God and Black churches that would become bedrock institutions in the long struggle to dismantle slavery, culminating in the Civil War. With Emancipation and Reconstruction, independent Black churches flourished and helped the formerly enslaved navigate a perilous freedom.

Episode 2 sees the the Black church expanding its reach to address social inequality and minister to those in need, from the exodus out of the Jim Crow South during the Great Migration to the heroic phase of the civil rights movement in the 1950s and '60s. After the violent loss of leaders like the Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King Jr., many Black churches found themselves at a crossroads — struggling to remain relevant in an era of increasing secularization while reckoning with urgent social and cultural issues within their congregations and broader communities. The series brings the story of the Black Church up to the present — a time of renewed struggle for racial justice in America.

Since their first publication in 1970, the beloved books of James Alfred Wight, published under the pen name James Herriot, have held a special place in people's hearts throughout the world. Chronicling the heartwarming and humorous adventures of a young country vet, the books introduced readers to his unconventional mentor and the cast of farmers and townsfolk who lived and worked in the Yorkshire Dales in the 1930s.

This new adaptation will preserve the rich spirit, tone and values of Herriot's iconic characters and stories and will bring to life his sharply observed, entertaining and incredibly funny tales of country life in the North of England for a modern audience, introducing a new generation to his life-affirming stories.

Never out of print, the books have sold 60 million copies internationally becoming a global cultural phenomenon with devoted fans around the world. Their focus on community and its importance in our lives gives Herriot's work an enduring power and contemporary resonance that reminds us all that belonging to a community makes us part of something greater than ourselves.

James Alfred Wight OBE FRCVS was a veterinary surgeon who graduated from Glasgow Veterinary College at the age of 23. He headed to a veterinary practice in Thirsk, Yorkshire, in 1940 where he fell in love with the Dales and the woman he would marry, Joan Danbury. Wight later wrote stories based on his own adventures as a young country vet, under the pen name James Herriot. Herriot quickly became one of Britain's best-loved authors.

Jim Wight and Rosie Page, Wight's children, say: "The books of James Herriot have enchanted millions of readers worldwide for almost half a century. We are delighted that our father's work will be brought to life once again for a new generation of viewers Great and Small."
