THE ORATORIO:

A Documentary with Martin Scorsese

Fri, Nov 5 – 9pm

Martin Scorsese reveals the fascinating story of a one-night-only performance in 1826 at St. Patrick's Old Cathedral—Scorsese's home church in Little Italy—that marked the arrival of Italian opera in the New World.

This watershed event was lost to history for almost 200 years, but was recently rediscovered and restaged by an Italian opera company at the historic church. The film explores the richness of the immigrant experience, the beginning of a cultural awakening in America, and the enduring power of art.

THE ORATORIO is populated with unforgettable real-life characters, including Lorenzo Da Ponte, Mozart's librettist, who, after being banished from Vienna, ended up in New York City working as a grocer; Pierre Toussaint, a freed slave who became a successful hairdresser and the primary benefactor for building St. Patrick's Old Cathedral; and opera's first diva, Maria Malibran, whose performances in America inspired young women to take up singing lessons.

Scorsese has a deeply personal connection to the cathedral and its surrounding neighborhood. He grew up around the corner and served as an altar boy at the two-centuries-old church where the original staging and restaging of the oratorio took place. In the documentary, he explores the neighborhood's history, its transition from Irish to Italian, and the incredible influence it had on "the way I view my world and my work."

Immediately following the documentary, the Italian opera company Teatro Lirico di Cagliari performs the restaged concert, lost to history for almost 200 years. Through the meticulous research of Basilica Music Director Lamenzo and Italian musicologist Zimei, the program recreates as closely as possible what was heard in 1826.

Uncover the truth behind the origins of the stones of Stonehenge, the mystery of the fatal Hindenburg airship crash, and an historic expedition led by a samurai and Franciscan monk.

The First Circle of Stonehenge – Nov 3

A decade-long archaeological quest reveals that the oldest stones of Stonehenge originally belonged to a much earlier sacred site: a stone circle built on a rugged, remote hillside in West Wales. Using the latest tools of geotechnology, a dedicated team of archaeologists painstakingly searched for the evidence that would fill in a 400-year gap in our knowledge of the site's bluestones.

Hindenburg's Fatal Flaws – Nov 10

In 1937, the Hindenburg airship exploded into flames upon landing and 36 people were killed in the horrifying crash, shocking the world and sealing the fate of airship travel. The exact cause of the Hindenburg's crash remained a mystery. Now, recently discovered letters, maintenance reports and company memos reveal the unfortunate errors that led to the disaster. More than 80 years later, experts suspect that, had critical construction flaws been fixed at the time, the airship might not have exploded.

A Samurai in the Vatican – Nov 17

In 1613, feudal lord Date Masamune sent a Japanese diplomatic mission to Europe to negotiate with the Pope and the King of Spain in hopes of opening a new trade route. Led by samurai Hasekura Tsunenaga and Franciscan monk Luis Sotelo, the expedition spent seven years traveling one-third of the globe. Discover the fate and legacy of these men caught up in the first stages of globalization and facing religious and political tensions.

The Caravaggio Heist – Nov 24

In 1984, a Maltese national treasure went missing from the cathedral of St. John in Valletta - a masterpiece by the legendary Italian master Caravaggio. Two years of investigations across Europe led to nothing, but a strong-willed priest never gave up. Father Marius Zerafa, director of museums in Malta, managed to establish a channel of communication with the thieves and set off on a quest to recover the priceless painting. Despite not having the money to pay their ransom, he risked everything, putting his life on the line for the sake of a masterpiece.

Based on the Pulitzer Prize-winning book by *Wall Street Journal* senior writer Douglas A. Blackmon and narrated by acclaimed actor Laurence Fishburne, the film challenges the belief that slavery in this country ended with the Emancipation Proclamation.

Even as chattel slavery came to an end in the South in 1865, thousands of African Americans were pulled back into forced labor with shocking force and brutality. It was a system in which men, often guilty of no crime at all, were arrested, compelled to work without pay, repeatedly bought and sold, and coerced to do the bidding of masters. Tolerated by both the North and South, forced labor lasted well into the 20th century.

"The Thirteenth Amendment states that slavery was abolished, except as a punishment for a crime," says author and co-executive producer Blackmon. "So across the South, laws were passed to criminalize everyday African-American life. It was a crime for a black man to walk beside a railroad, to speak loudly in the company of white women, to do someone's laundry without a license, to sell cotton after dark. But the most damaging statutes were around vagrancy. If you couldn't prove your employment at any moment, you were a criminal."

Once convicted, African Americans were leased to coal mines, brick yards, plantations and turpentine farms and forced to work without pay. They were shackled, imprisoned and often tortured. Thousands died.

"It's a brutal topic," said producer/director Sam Pollard. "Forced labor practices, including inmate leasing and peonage, totally circumscribed the lives of hundreds of thousands of African Americans well into the 20th century. Most Americans are totally unaware of — and shocked by — this history, which is why we found it so imperative to translate Doug's incredible book into a film."
