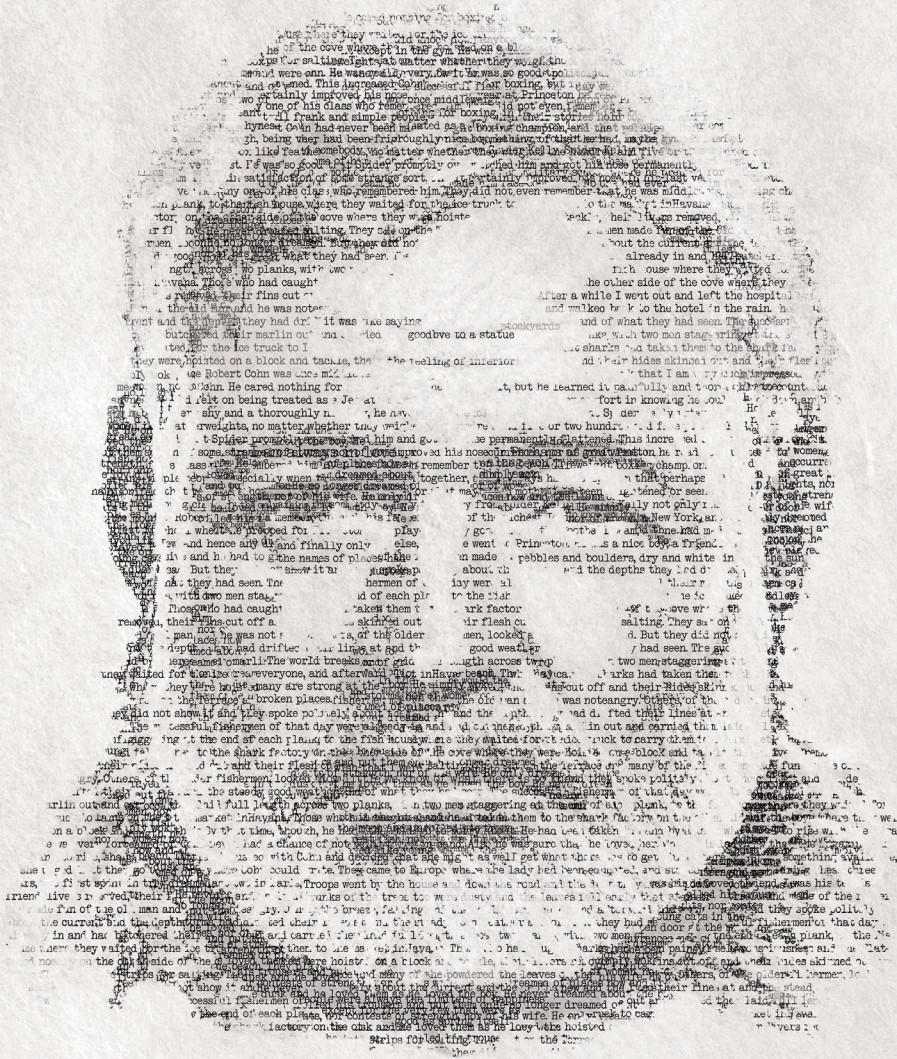

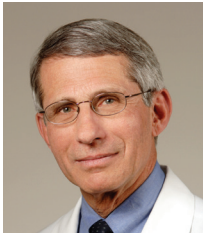

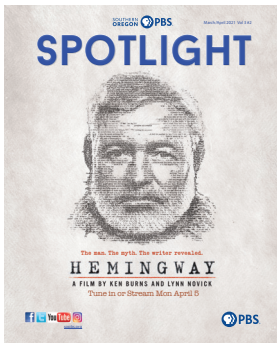

Education in a Year of Pandemic

Educating during the Covid-19 pandemic has been one of the most difficult tasks of my lifetime. Last school year, 2019-2020, was the inaugural year for PBS NewsHour student reporting labs sites (SRL) in Southern Oregon.

This curriculum teaches students the fundamentals of video journalism and we had started SRL pilot classes at three schools. Getting these pilot programs off the ground was a struggle, even before March 13, 2020, when schools

announced they were shutting down, and eventually going to online instruction for the rest of the school year.

Our SRL project was temporarily halted, but one of our school partners asked us if we wouldn't help early elementary teachers make telecourses that could be sent home to students that did not have internet connectivity. We eventually started airing these episodes on SO PBS during the months of April and May, 2020. (They are re-airing this year for students as well!)

This work was arduous, but rewarding.

After the school year ended, we were able to reconvene our SRL teacher partners and start planning for the 2020-2021 school year, which would be all online via video conferencing and virtual classrooms.

Right away we realized we had rewrite much of the curriculum for distance learning. We couldn't have students use the industry-level DSLR cameras we acquired for the classroom because we didn't have enough to send home to all students. So, we taught students how to use their smartphones as field production cameras and their bodies as tripods. Instead of using *Adobe Premiere* for editing, we had students use WeVideo online. The only major issue was sound, but for education purposes, their phones audio worked fine.

Then we got news that the state was working to get students back into the school building. New challenges included a new A/B schedule, so we will only see a student twice a week, as opposed to every day. Students have not touched DSLR cameras yet this school year, and need to be taught exposition and composition for new camera, lighting and sound systems. And once again, the curriculum needed to be reworked for a short face-to-face remainder of the school year.

It's been a long year, but I am grateful for the opportunity to make a difference in the lives of our region's students. As a co-teacher and an industry partner, I know that whatever my challenges were over the last year, the reimagining of education has been much more complicated for the dedicated teachers in our area.

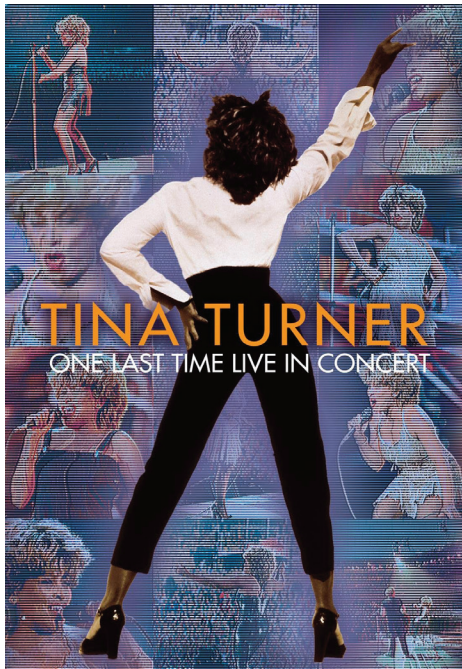

KILLING THE KLAMATH



This documentary tells the story of the Klamath Tribes' fight to save the sacred C'waam and Koptu fish, and a dying lake.

Thursday, March 18 at 8:30pm; Saturday, March 20 at 7pm; Sunday, March 21 at 6:30pm

Known for its scenic beauty and spectacular wildlife, the Klamath Basin also sees its share of controversy as communities grapple with how to meet the water needs of people, farms, and fish.

Told by tribal leaders and scientists, *Killing the Klamath* explores the causes, consequences, and potential solutions to toxic algae blooms in Upper Klamath Lake that are driving C'waam and Koptu to extinction. Boating, birding, paddling, and fishing are other casualties of a dying lake.

Once the most important food fish in Oregon's Upper Klamath Lake region, C'waam and Koptu were caught by the thousands and remain a centerpiece of the Tribes' way of life and annual

Return of the C'waam ceremony. The Tribes' creation story tells us "If the C'waam go away, the people go away."

Today, the Tribes are desperately working to save the C'waam through conservation, better management of scarce water and reducing polluted run-off from agriculture and cattle operations.

Healing the lake and restoring the habitat C'waam and Koptu need to live won't be easy, but common sense, inexpensive solutions that can be implemented right away will make a real difference. Ultimately, the Tribes want to heal the lands and waters of their ancestral home and restore sustainable fisheries as a cornerstone of their plan for economic self-sufficiency.

CODED BIAS

Monday, March 22– 10pm

In an increasingly data-driven, automated world, the question of how to protect individuals' civil liberties in the face of artificial intelligence looms larger by the day. Directed by award-winning filmmaker Shalini Kantayya, CODED BIAS follows MIT Media Lab researcher Joy Buolamwini, along with data scientists, mathematicians and watchdog groups from different parts of the world, as they fight to expose the discrimination within the facial recognition algorithms now prevalent across all spheres of daily life.

While conducting research on facial recognition technology at the MIT Media Lab, computer scientist Joy Buolamwini made the startling discovery that the algorithm could not detect darkskinned faces or women with accuracy. This led to the harrowing realization that the very machine learning algorithms intended to avoid prejudice are only as unbiased as the humans and historical data programming them.

The film documents the dramatic journey that follows, from discovery to exposure to activism, as Buolamwini goes public with her findings and undertakes an effort to create a movement toward accountability and transparency, even testifying before Congress to push for the first-ever legislation governing facial recognition in the United States.

Around the world, artificial intelligence has already permeated every facet of public and private life, automating decisions about who gets hired, who gets health insurance and how long a prison term should be—theoretically casting analyses and insights that are free from human prejudice. In addition to following Buolamwini's journey, Kantayya also goes to London, where police are piloting the use of facial recognition technology; Houston, Texas, where teachers are evaluated via algorithms; and Hangzhou, China, which is quickly becoming a model for city-wide surveillance. And in each of these places, she profiles data scientists, mathematicians, ethicists, and individuals impacted by these disruptive technologies who are fighting to shed light on the impact of bias in A.I. on civil rights and democracy, and to call for greater accountability.

THE BLINDING OF ISAAC WOODARD

Tuesday, March 30 – 9pm

In 1946, Isaac Woodard, a Black army sergeant on his way home to South Carolina after serving in WWII, was taken off a Greyhound bus after a heated exchange with the driver, who refused to let him off at a rest stop to use the restroom. The local chief of police savagely beat him, leaving him unconscious and permanently blind. The shocking incident made national headlines and, when the police chief was acquitted by an all-white jury, the blatant injustice would change the course of American history.

Based on Richard Gergel's book *Unexamined Courage*, the film details how the crime led to the racial awakenings of South Carolina Judge J. Waties Waring and President Harry Truman, who desegregated federal offices and the military two years later.

The event also ultimately set the stage for the Supreme Court's landmark 1954 *Brown v. Board of Education* decision, which finally outlawed segregation in public schools and jumpstarted the modern civil rights movement.

"THE BLINDING OF ISAAC WOODARD illustrates how a single individual can be the spark that ignites a movement and creates a seismic shift in public opinion," said Cameo George, American Experience executive producer. "Although his name is little-known today, Isaac Woodard's story changed hearts and minds—and the law of the land."

In this miniseries, a princess steals the heart of the president of the United States in an epic drama based on the World War II relationship of Franklin D. Roosevelt and Norwegian Crown Princess Martha.

Kyle MacLachlan stars as Roosevelt, opposite Swedish star Sofia Helin as the beautiful Martha, who flees the Nazis with her three young children and lives under Roosevelt's protection. The eight-part series co-stars Tobias Santelmann as Crown Prince Olav and Harriet Sansom Harris as First Lady Eleanor Roosevelt.

The series is based on a little-known but true story from World War II, when Norwegian Crown Princess Martha prevailed on President Franklin Roosevelt to help save her country from imminent German conquest. The drama follows the relationship that developed between them.

MY GRANDPARENTS' WAR

Sundays, April 4-25 at 8pm

Combining key moments in history with compelling personal stories, the four-part series takes a fascinating journey into the past to understand the extraordinary impact of World War II on the families of four British actors. Helena Bonham Carter, Mark Rylance, Kristin Scott Thomas, and Carey Mulligan each host a one-hour journey into their respective family histories as they travel to historic locations, from the beaches of Dunkirk to the former site of a prisoner-of-war camp in Hong Kong, to retrace their grandparents' footsteps during the conflict that changed their lives forever.

April 4

Helena Bonham Carter's grandparents—two in France, two in England—weren't conventional war heroes. They didn't fight in any battles but did save countless lives - helping Jewish people escape the Holocaust as the Nazis invaded France.

April 11

Actor and peace activist Mark Rylance explores the World War II story of his grandfather, Osmond Skinner, who spent almost 4 years as a Japanese prisoner of war.

April 18

Kristin Scott Thomas' grandfather, William Scott Thomas, served as a commanding officer in the Royal Navy throughout World War II. He survived some of the most devastating battles, from Dunkirk to D-Day, but never spoke about his experiences.

April 25

Carey Mulligan's grandfather, Denzil Booth, a teenager from the Welsh Valleys, traveled thousands of miles to fight the Japanese military aboard Britain's biggest warship—the first ever attacked by kamikaze aircraft.

In 2017, Krasner, a civil rights attorney who sued the Philadelphia Police Department 75 times throughout his career, mounted a longshot campaign supported by activists and organizers, and ultimately won the District Attorney's seat in a city that has the highest incarceration rate of any large city in the United States. Philly D.A. brings viewers inside the emotional, high-stakes work that Krasner and an ensemble of idealistic outsiders from different walks of life take on as they attempt a fundamental overhaul of an expansive, entrenched criminal justice system.

The series follows Krasner's team undertaking this so-called "social experiment" as they push reforms such as prosecuting police misconduct and brutality, rethinking sentencing, probation and parole reform, minimizing the use of cash bail and ending pursuit of the death penalty.

"The District Attorney has arguably more power over the lives of everyday Americans than any other elected official, but its offices are known as the 'black box of the criminal justice system,'" said filmmakers Ted Passon and Yoni Brook. "Through Philly D.A., we are able to bring the public behind the scenes of this pivotal and often opaque institution, and to create a 360-degree portrait of our city in the midst of change. We're thrilled to show the series to audiences for the first time at Sundance."

Through real-time interviews with Krasner, his team, and those who disagree with his approach, including prosecutors in his own district attorney's office, sitting judges, victims of crime, and law enforcement officials, PHILLY D.A. captures a never-before-seen, in-depth look inside the justice system as an old and new guard clash. As the movement for criminal justice reform sweeps the nation, electing reform minded prosecutors in cities like Chicago, Boston and Los Angeles, Philadelphia serves as a tale that is both cautionary and inspiring.

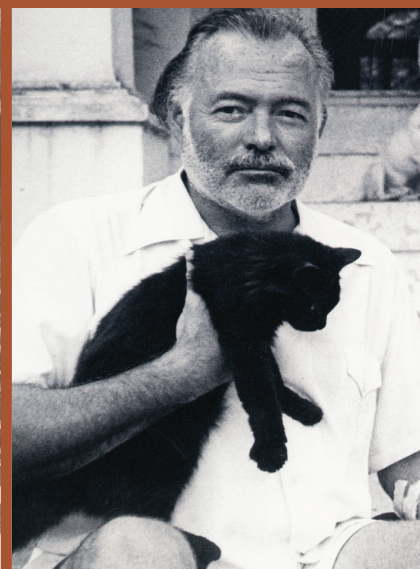

A FILM BY KEN BURNS AND LYNN NOVICK

The three-part, six-hour film paints an intimate picture of Hemingway the writer — who captured on paper the complexities of the human condition in spare and profound prose, and whose work remains deeply influential around the world — while also penetrating the myth of Hemingway the man's man to reveal a deeply troubled and ultimately tragic figure. The film also explores Hemingway's limitations and biases as an artist and a man of his time.

Written by Geoffrey C. Ward and produced by Sarah Botstein, both longtime collaborators of Burns and Novick — the film interweaves a close study of the biographical events of the author's life with excerpts from his fiction, non-fiction and short stories, informed by interviews with celebrated writers, scholars and Hemingway's son, Patrick. The filmmakers explore the painstaking process through which Hemingway created some of the most important works of fiction in American letters, including novels *The Sun Also Rises*, *A Farewell to Arms*, *For Whom the Bell Tolls* and *The Old Man and the Sea*; short stories "Hills Like White Elephants," "The Short and Happy Life of Francis Macomber," "Up in Michigan," "Indian Camp" and "The Snows of Kilimanjaro," as well as the nonfiction works *Death in the Afternoon* and *A Moveable Feast*.

Narrated by long-time collaborator Peter Coyote, the series features an all-star cast of actors bringing Hemingway (voiced by Jeff Daniels), his friends and family vividly to life. Through letters to and from his four wives — voiced by Meryl Streep, Keri Russell, Mary Louise Parker and Patricia Clarkson — the film reveals Hemingway at his most romantic and his most vulnerable, grappling at times with insecurity, anxiety and existential loneliness.

"I've always admired Hemingway's writing," said Daniels. "The power of his simplicity changed literature. Reading his published work along with his unpublished letters gave me new insight into his impact as an artist and the ultimate tragedy of his life."

Ernest Hemingway "loved being in love," the writer Michael Katakis says in the film. He married four times over the course of his tumultuous life and had three sons. His relationships with women — his mother, sisters, wives and the World War I nurse who broke his heart — profoundly affected his work. Yet for all his bravado and hyper-masculine posturing, Hemingway wrote about relationships between men and women with sensitivity, nuance and clarity. As writer Edna O'Brien says on camera, he was able to put himself "inside the skin" of the other and give voice to women's deepest emotions.

"In an era when Americans are re-evaluating so many icons, Hemingway is a particularly compelling figure to revisit," said director Lynn Novick. "He was hugely complicated, deeply flawed, and he truly revolutionized the art of writing. One of the great revelations of this project was asking renowned writers from around the world — Mario Vargas Llosa, Edna O'Brien, Abraham Verghese, Leonardo Padura, Mary Karr — to share their insights into Hemingway's work and why it's still important today."

The documentary tracks the meteoric rise and tragic fall of the author who, in his final years, suffered from chronic alcoholism, serious mental illness, traumatic brain injuries and depression. In 1961, at the age of 61, Hemingway died by suicide, leaving behind an unparalleled body of artistic work and a complicated emotional legacy for those closest to him.
