David Tennant stars as Phileas Fogg in Jules Verne's tale about a daring bet in the 1870s to circle the globe in just eighty days. Ibrahim Koma plays Fogg's resourceful valet, with Leonie Benesch as the intrepid reporter who accompanies them.

MASTERPIECE updates Verne's plot with exciting new themes, characters, and incidents. The round-the-world feat would be hard enough for the trio, even if someone wasn't trying to sabotage them at every turn.

EPISODE 1 – SUN, JAN 2

Phileas Fogg bets a fortune that he can circle the Earth in no more than eighty days. He enlists a new valet and attracts a persistent reporter. The three run amok in Paris.

EPISODE 2 – SUN, JAN 9

Having survived mayhem in France, Fogg and his party are crossing Italy when their train comes to a screeching halt. Can they continue and save a boy's life in the process?

EPISODE 3 – SUN, JAN 16

To meet their connection in Aden, Fogg and Passepartout hire a camel driver to cross the desert. Bad idea! Can Abigail and her new acquaintances rescue them?

EPISODE 4 – SUN, JAN 23

Invited to a wedding in India, Fogg has his diplomatic skill tested when a British officer arrests the groom. Unwittingly drugged, Fogg spills his true motivation for the trip to Abigail.

EPISODE 5 – SUN, JAN 30

Though wealthy, Fogg discovers that someone has put a hold on his credit in Hong Kong, making further progress impossible. Passepartout puts his larceny skills to use.

EPISODE 6 – SUN, FEB 6

Facing starvation on a desert island, Fogg and Passepartout have a falling out. The valet's survival skills are desperately needed to save their lives, much less the wager.

EPISODE 7 – SUN, FEB 13

Arrived in the Old West, the three adventurers meet a lawman with his fugitive captive. Making their next train connection hinges on Abigail's journalistic cool in a shootout.

EPISODE 8 – SUN, FEB 20

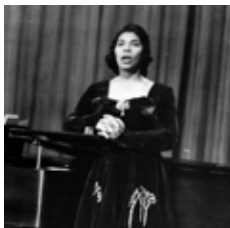
Fogg meets on old friend at New York's Grand Central Depot and must decide whether to continue his trip. Unbeknownst to him, astronomical effects will decide the outcome.

AMERICAN MASTERS Marian Anderson: The Whole World in Her Hands

TUES, FEB 2 – 9pm

With unprecedented access to the Marian Anderson Estate, this 90-minute documentary explores the life, career, art and legacy of the singer of classical music and spirituals.

Best known for her performance at the legendary Freedom Concert on April 9, 1939, Anderson, in a bold protest against racial intolerance, sang before a diverse crowd on the steps of the Lincoln Memorial in Washington, D.C., after being denied use of Constitution Hall by the Daughters of the American Revolution.

In that moment, Anderson — despite being a fiercely private person — transformed into a symbol for the nascent civil rights movement, even inspiring a 10-year-old Martin Luther King, Jr., who listened on the radio.

Affectionately known to audiences as “The Lady from Philadelphia” and “The People’s Princess,” Anderson’s career was propelled by her talent, but also steered by the limits imposed by racism and segregation. This gifted pioneer, whose strength was rooted in family and community, overcame humiliation, prejudice and financial hardship to become a voice for justice, an internationally renowned master of her craft and the first African American to sing a leading role at the Metropolitan Opera in 1955.

Balancing her public triumph with her personal struggles and resilience, the film charts the impact of one of the world’s greatest singers, whose career provides a window into a time of seismic cultural change.

FANNIE LOU HAMER'S AMERICA: An America ReFramed Special

TUES, FEB 22 – 8pm

"I'm sick and tired of being sick and tired." Most Americans have heard that famous line, but few know who said it. Mississippi sharecropper-turned-civil-rights-activist, Fannie Lou Hamer, known in the 1960s and 70s for her powerful speeches, soul-stirring songs, and impassioned pleas for equal rights, has largely been forgotten.

Hamer was born in Mississippi in 1917, the 20th and last child of sharecroppers. She grew up in poverty and toiled on a plantation picking cotton until 1962. In 1961, she received a hysterectomy by a white doctor without her consent while undergoing surgery to remove a uterine tumor. Such forced sterilization of Black women was so widespread it was dubbed a "Mississippi appendectomy."

Hamer was incensed by efforts to deny Blacks the right to vote. She became a SNCC organizer and led 17 volunteers to register to vote at a Mississippi Courthouse. Denied the right to vote due to an unfair literacy test, the group was harassed on their way home, when police stopped their bus and fined them \$100 for the charge that the bus was too yellow.

Her reputation soared as she co-founded the Mississippi Freedom Democratic Party (MFDP), which challenged the local Democratic Party's efforts to block Black participation. She was known for her poignant descriptions of racial prejudice in the South, and she traveled extensively, giving speeches about civil rights. She also helped found the National Women's Political Caucus, and launched the Freedom Farm Cooperative (FFC), buying up land that Blacks could own and farm collectively.

In this film, the person who Malcolm X called the "country's number one freedom fighting woman" tells her own story – in her own words – by means of archival audio footage and rarely seen television appearances recorded throughout her political and humanitarian career.

After working hard to become accepted by the local farmers and prove himself indispensable, Siegfried made James a senior vet in the Skeldale House veterinary practice.

Following years of half-hearted effort, Tristan believed he had finally passed his veterinary exams. Siegfried, however, learned that Tristan failed once again, but didn’t have the heart to tell him. Meanwhile, Mrs. Hall was heartbroken when she was unable to reconnect with her estranged son.

As season two opens, James returns from Glasgow where he has been visiting his parents for Easter. While there he is offered a job at a modern local veterinary practice and must decide between staying home in Glasgow with his elderly parents or returning to his new life in Yorkshire.

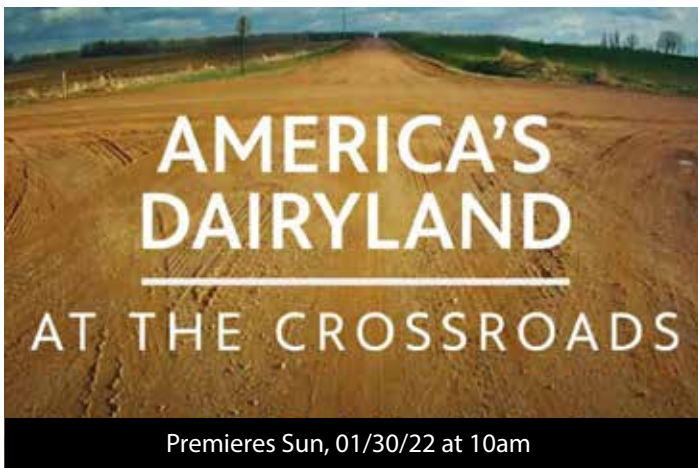
