



SOPBS EDUCATION MANAGER ANNA FORD HELLO SOUTHERN OREGON PBS!

It's great to be here and have this opportunity to update you all on my work over the past three months and share my vision for the future. Our community is currently grappling with a wide range of critical issues, such as poverty, equity and inclusion, substance abuse, and the pressing matter of climate change. As the Education Manager, my role is to create educational opportunities that address these challenges and empower all members of our community.

Through conversations with community members, partners, parents, and grandparents, it has become clear that media literacy is a pressing need across all age groups. Independent thinking and 21st-century literacy skills are valued by both grandparents and grandkids alike. Therefore, I am excited to expand our Media Literacy offerings, not just within classrooms, but also beyond.

In the coming six months, Southern Oregon PBS will partner with KQED to offer Media Literacy certification to local educators, librarians, and community members. This certification will be available free of charge, and individuals will have the opportunity to learn independently or within a local cohort. We are eagerly anticipating an array of classes as diverse and unique as each Southern Oregon educator.

Furthermore, we are actively pursuing a grant with Work Source to provide technical training and job placement opportunities as an extension of the PBS NewsHour Student Reporting Labs (SRL). During the course of running the SRL program, we identified an obstacle faced by several students: poverty. Despite their accomplishments in the program and their passion for learning, they had to drop out to work and support their families.

This grant would enable us to offer paid opportunities for students to work towards a certification in digital marketing and communication. The program aims to provide immediate employment prospects and potentially lead to a lifetime of higher earnings for these students. To accomplish this, we are hoping to collaborate with Southern Oregon University (SOU), where SOU will provide classroom training, and Southern Oregon PBS will offer job readiness internships.

These initiatives reflect our commitment to meeting the evolving educational needs of our community. By prioritizing media literacy, expanding certification opportunities, and providing targeted job placement programs, we are actively equipping individuals with the skills and knowledge necessary to thrive in the modern world.

In closing, I am grateful for the support and collaboration of the Southern Oregon PBS team, members, community partners, and educators in these endeavors. Together, we can make a profound difference in the lives of our community members by providing them with the tools to navigate the media landscape effectively and pursue meaningful employment opportunities. Let us continue to work together to build a stronger, more resilient Southern Oregon community.

When D.I. Rachita Ray, a British–Asian policewoman new to homicide is assigned to investigate the suspected honor killing of a young Muslim man, she quickly realizes the suspects can't be guilty. The evidence against the two brothers from a British Hindu family is flimsy at best. Her attempts at conveying this to her superiors and her colleagues fall on deaf ears, hidden biases and a keenness to wrap the case up mean no one is listening to her.

That is until her probing leads the team to a much more sinister crime. In this four-part drama, D.I. Ray goes on a journey that sees her uncover a complex web of deceit within organized crime, whilst laying bare the wounds deep within herself that she's spent a lifetime ignoring. Wounds that are born from a desperate desire to "fit in," despite not looking the part.

July 9 – Episode1: D.I. Rachita Ray is promoted to Homicide, but realizes instantly she is there to "tick a box" and that the so-called "culturally-specific homicide" she is assigned to, is anything but.

July 16 – Episode 2: Rachita and the team race to track down Anjuli Kapoor, making more than one grim discovery in the process. This is no honor crime.

July 23 – Episode 3: The body count continues to rise as Rachita and the team uncover more evidence suggesting they are dealing with highly dangerous organized criminals.

July 30 – Episode 4: Rachita makes a shocking discovery which has a huge impact on both her investigation and her personal life.





COUNTRY MUSIC chronicles country music's early days, from southern Appalachia's songs of struggle, heartbreak and faith to the rollicking Western swing of Texas, California's honky-tonks and Nashville's "Grand Ole Opry." The film follows the evolution of country music over the course of the 20th century as it eventually emerges to become "America's music."

The documentary explores crucial questions — "What is country music?" and "Where did it come from?"— while focusing on the biographies of the fascinating trailblazers who created and shaped it from the Carter Family, Jimmie Rodgers, Bill Monroe and Bob Wills to Hank Williams, Patsy Cline, Johnny Cash, Merle Haggard, Loretta Lynn, Charley Pride, Willie Nelson, Dolly Parton, Emmylou Harris, Garth Brooks and many more — as well as the times in which they lived. Much like the music itself, the film tells unforgettable stories of hardships and joys shared by everyday people.

"At the heart of every great country music song is a story," said Ken Burns. "As the songwriter Harlan Howard said, 'It's three chords and the truth.' The common experiences and human emotions speak to each of us about love and loss, about hard times and the chance of redemption. As an art form, country music is also forever revisiting its history, sharing and updating old classics and celebrating its roots, which are, in many ways, foundational to our country itself."

ONCE UPON A TIME IN NORTHERN IRELAND August 28 – 30

This powerful five-part series gives voice to the people who lived through Northern Ireland's violent past by sharing intimate, unheard testimonies from all sides of the conflict. The series combines unfiltered personal accounts with archival footage to tell the story of the people and communities that had to live with conflict daily — and are still dealing with its legacies today.

It Wasn't Like a Movie Anymore

August 28 at 9pm – Episode1

Northern Ireland's progression from relative peace to fullblown conflict was rapid, and when 13 unarmed Catholics were shot dead by British Paratroopers on "Bloody Sunday," it was seen as a recruitment drive for the Provisional IRA.

Do Paramilitaries Lie Awake at Night?

August 28 at 10pm – Episode 2

In 1972, a deeply segregated society emerged, with many Catholic and Protestant working-class communities policed by paramilitary organizations. Hatred and fear of the 'other side' are endemic, as is a devotion to one's own culture and traditions.

So Many Broken Hearts

August 29 at 9pm – Episode 3

The devastating impact of the conflict is explored through the stories of three women. Car bombs and assassinations are now part of everyday life in Northern Ireland.

Loose Talk Costs Lives

August 29 at 10pm – Episode 4

By the late 1980s, the news in Northern Ireland is a daily list of the dead. The conflict becomes an intelligence war. To prevent further terrorist violence, there are efforts to infiltrate paramilitary organizations. "Trust nobody" is the mantra.

Who Wants To Live Like That

August 30 at 10pm – Episode 5

It seemed that violence might escalate further, but following years of negotiations between politicians, paramilitaries and the British and Irish Governments, an IRA ceasefire was announced in 1994. Still, peace came at a cost.



osted by biologist and Princeton University professor Shane Campbell-Staton, Ph.D., this part-science, part-travel series takes viewers from high-tech labs to sweltering street markets, from farms to restaurants, and from primeval forests to the back alleys of New York to explore the ways humans are transforming the planet — and what those transformations tell us about who we are as a species. HUMAN FOOTPRINT is a visually stunning series set to an original score by legendary hip-hop and jazz producer Adrian Younge.

In 4.5 billion years, the planet has never experienced anything like humans; we are no ordinary organism. Even our most basic needs — food, water, and shelter — place a staggering burden on the planet's resources. Through unique interactions with an eclectic cast of characters — from scientists and historians to rat exterminators and dog dancing gurus — Shane discovers the complex motivations behind our impacts and unveils opportunities for a less lopsided coexistence.

Each episode of HUMAN FOOTPRINT is built on a foundation of science, but the biggest lessons are about human nature. The series is not a "doom and gloom" tale of human villainy. Instead, it is an honest reckoning with our vast footprint and our species' singular history of transforming the planet. The series' six episodes cover a wide range of topics: invasive species that are both deeply devastating to ecosystems and critical components of culture; how it came to pass that once-wild wolves now work, sleep, and dance (that's right, dance) alongside us; how five species that met our needs have hitched a ride along with us to global domination; the way that modern cities are both deadly and delightful for their inhabitants; and the science and history behind a crop with an outsized impact on culture — cotton.
